# Background

- In April 2011, TIRExB approved the final version of the survey on the TIR guarantee level and on the functioning of the TIR guarantee system
- The electronic survey was sent out in June 2011
- The deadline for replies was 30 September 2011.
- ECE/TRANS/WP.30/AC.2/2012/7





# Replies

- 42 countries have replied to the questionnaire:
  - Armenia; Austria; Azerbaijan; Belarus; Belgium; Bosnia and Herzegovina; Bulgaria; Croatia; Cyprus; Czech Republic; Estonia; Spain; Finland; France; Germany; Greece; Hungary; Ireland; Italy; Kazakhstan; Kyrgyzstan; Lithuania; Latvia; Montenegro; Morocco; Netherlands; Norway; Poland; Portugal; Republic of Moldova; Romania; Russia; Serbia; Slovakia; Slovenia; Sweden; Switzerland; The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia; Turkey; Ukraine; United Kingdom; Uzbekistan.
- 18 did not have any claims to report.





### Results

- Customs claims against national guaranteeing associations
  - EU countries & Non-EU countries
- Customs claims against the persons directly liable
  - EU countries & Non-EU countries
- TIR guarantee level
  - EU countries & Non-EU countries





#### Selected results

- Average claim value
  - EU : € 17'110 / Non EU : € 18'874
- Claims withdrawn
  - EU: 60 % / Non EU: 17 %
- Claims subject to legal proceedings
  - EU: 9 / Non EU: 80
- Numerous remarks regarding the current TIR guarantee level (e.g.: insufficient, not in line with current economic reality, SDR, ...)

### Comparison with the results of the 2007 survey

	2011 survey	2007 survey
Average number of lodged claims per year	201	866
Average amount of lodged claims per year (€)	3 630 378	22 625 657
Average number of claims paid per year	91	58
Average amount of claims paid per year (€)	1 705 851	853 984
Average value of lodged claim (€)	17 992	26 142
Claim rate (1 per # issued carnets)	14 193	3 900





### Comparison with the results of the 2007 survey

- Significant drop in the claims rate from 1 claims per 3900 TIR Carnet in the 2007 survey to 1 per 14193 in the 2011 survey
- The average claim amount dropped by more than 30%
- Annual average number and amount of paid claims has increased significantly but remains less than half of the figures reported for the period 1999–2001 (237)

# Comparison with the IRU claims statistics 1/2

- Different numbers of claims lodged each year (IRU figure should be greater)
- IRU statistics do not add up,
  i.e. (d)<sub>t</sub> ≠(d)<sub>t-1</sub>+(a)<sub>t</sub>-(b)<sub>t</sub>-(c)<sub>t</sub>
- 150 claims raised during the period 2007-2010 are still pending
- 6436 pending claims date back from before 2007





## Comparison with the IRU claims statistics 2/2

- Potential reasons
  - Different numbers of claims lodged each year
    - Incomplete coverage.
    - Date of issuance vs date of receipt of the claim
    - Multiple claims for a single TIR Carnet
    - Persons directly liable vs national guaranteeing associations
    - Miscommunication between local and central Customs administrations
    - IRU software for claims handling
  - IRU statistics do not add up
    - A set of claims from 1 country taken out from IRU's claims database
- IRU can provide WP.30 with data covering extended periods of time (rather than just for a single year)





### Other issues for consideration

- In the EU, 66% of payments is made after the 3 month deadline
- 85% in non EU countries
- EU: 60% of claims are withdrawn (In one country: 85 to 100% → EC)
- In a number of countries, additional guarantees are required when the TIR Carnet does not cover the totality of Customs duties and taxes.







### Next steps

- Ensure that the majority of payments is made before the deadline set by the TIR Conventions (3 months deadline) by promoting best practices
- Identify the reason for the high numbers of withdrawals in the EU (EC)
- Define the time period for the IRU's reporting of claims to WP.30
- Include more details on pending claims in the next survey
- Survey every two years
- Consider the relevance of a 50,000US\$ guarantee level in the light of the evolution of the real value of the guarantee
