Mandate

- 1. This document is submitted in line with cluster 5: Inland Waterway Transport, paragraph 5.1 of the programme of work 2018–2019 (ECE/TRANS/2018/21/Add.1) adopted by the Inland Transport Committee at its eightieth session (20–23 February 2018) (ECE/TRANS/274, para. 123).
- 2. The secretariat reproduces below an updated table on the current status of legal instruments on inland navigation questions and related international declarations, adopted both within and outside the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE), as well as the progress in a number of their Contracting Parties since the pan-European Conference on Inland Water Transport (13–14 September 2006, Bucharest).
- 3. The Working Party may wish to take note of the status of the legal instruments and decide on possible ways to proceed with those which have not yet entered into force or have a limited number of Contracting Parties.
