AEO general

Legislation/Certification (EU)

- Regulated Agent / Known Consignor
- ISPS (International Ship and Port facility Security)

Legislation/Certification (Non-EU)

- C-TPAT (VS)
- Stairsec (Sweden)
- PIP (Partners in Protection / Canada)

Commercial

- ISO (9000, 14000, 27001, 31000, etc.)
- TAPA (Transported Asset Protection Association): cargo crime





AEO general

Authorised Economic Operator: trusted actor in the supply chain



- Benefits from simplifications and facilitations
 - fewer physical controls
 - prior notification
 - etc.
- AEO status:
 - AEO-C(ustoms simplifications)
 - AEO-S(ecurity and safety)
 - AEO-C / AEO-S (may be held at the same time)





AEO criteria (EU: Union Customs Code)

- 1. Compliance with customs legislation and taxation rules
- 2. Administrative <u>system of recordkeeping</u>, managing commercial and transport records and allowing customs controls
- 3. Proven <u>financial solvency</u>
- 4. Practical standards of <u>competence</u> and professional <u>qualifications</u>
- 5. Where applicable, appropriate <u>security and safety</u> standards

An AEO should focus on processes, management of risk, internal controls and measures taken to reduce risks





AEO-S (security and safety)

Appropriate security and safety standards

- Building security
- Access controls
- Cargo security
- Business partner security
- Personnel security
- Security awareness programmes







AEO: indirect benefits

- reduced theft and losses;
- fewer delayed shipments;
- improved planning;
- improved customer service;
- improved customer loyalty;
- improved inventory management
- improved employee commitment;
- reduced security and safety incidents;
- lower inspection costs of suppliers and increased co-operation;
- reduced crime and vandalism;
- improved security and communication between supply chain partners.





AEO audit process

Top down approach (for example: security aspects)

- Security policy
- Implementation security policy in (organizational) security measures
- Internal control/audit of security measures

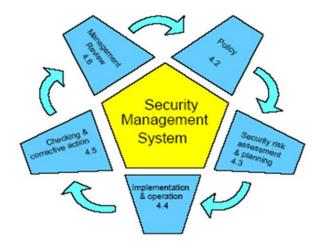


Figure 2 — Security management system elements





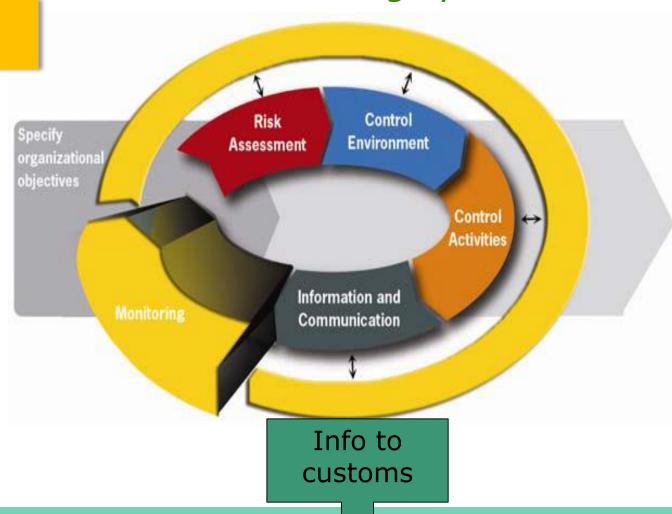

AEO monitoring

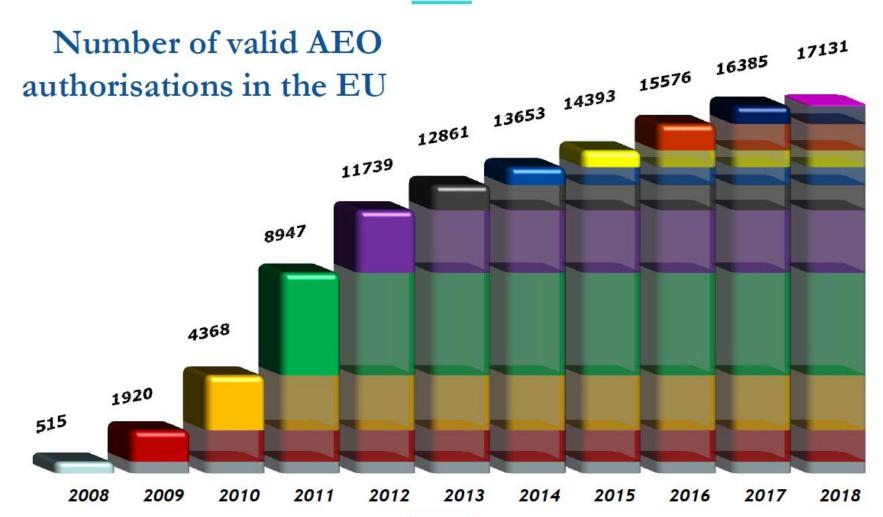
- Continuous monitoring by Customs.
- AEO monitoring (AEO field audit) every 3 years:
 - positive result
 - re-assessment
 - suspension
 - revocation
- High risk signals: immediate action by Customs!
- Checking AEO criteria based on company risk assessment, business AEO monitoring system

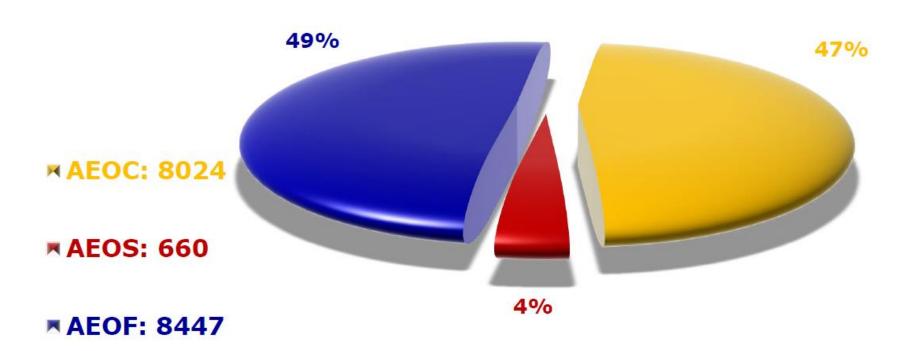
