



**The One Water Summit, co-organised by France and Kazakhstan aims to:**

- Mobilise at the highest political level, on the global water resilience and its links with all aspects of climate change, biodiversity and pollution
- Launch and accelerate existing initiatives and solutions, involving all types of stakeholders, and levels of governance
- Increase visibility and awareness toward next major milestones, including COP (UNFCCC, CDB, UNCCD) and the UN 2026 Water Conference



**The One Water Summit's deliverables will focus on several topics, contributing to:**

- a. Increase the visibility of the Water Convention and its tools, and support transboundary water cooperation projects and actors
- b. Catalyse efforts on knowledge, innovation and solutions for water management in the context of climate change
- c. Scaling up commitments on freshwater biodiversity preservation and restauration
- d. Increase private sector engagement and responsibility (water finance, water footprint etc)



## **Relevant deliverables for the work of the Water Convention:**

### **➤ OWS Deliverable 1: Visibility and globalisation of the Water Convention**

- a. Support entering of new countries to the Convention or encouraging them to begin the ratification process
- b. Improving visibility of the Convention, its potential to improve transboundary water management, as well as its capacity to contribute to the regional development, peace and security
- c. Encourage creation of twinning programmes
- d. Advancing accessions to the Protocol on Water and Health to the Water Convention and promote its tools (WASH in healthcare facilities, equitable access to water and sanitation, self-assessment methodology and national targets on water and sanitation affordability)
