If an arrow ends in month 04 (April) and the next arrow begins in month 07 (July), you may assume that the activity ended in the middle of April and the next activity began in the middle of August, that is, half of April, all of May and June, and half of July are blank. Since this is three months, we accept it. Had the next arrow instead begun in month 08 (August), the time gap would have been too long and we would have needed to get more information. Even if the respondent is able to give the exact date and make the time gap less than three months long (for example, if the activity above ended on April 31 and the next activity began on August 1, so the time gap is just three months), the following subtraction rules apply:

How do we compute for the turn of the year?

One alternative is to count on your fingers, another is to imagine a digital clock: If an arrow ends in month 11 (November) and the next begins in month 02 (March), give month 02 the number 14, Just as 2 o'clock corresponds to 14^{∞} on a digital clock. One then computes in the same way as above, that is, in our example 14-11=3, which is accepted.

Another example: An arrow ends in month 10 (October), the next begins in month 04 (April). Four o'clock counts as 16^{∞} and the subtraction becomes 16-10 = 6. In this case, get more information.

How do I check that the <u>activity</u> has continued for longer than 3 months?

Periods of three months or less should not be counted as an activity on their own. If the arrow would begin in month 02 (February) and end in month 05 (May), we assume that the activity lasted for exactly 3 months and since we are only interested in activities that have lasted longer than three months, we do not include this activity. In a similar fashion as above, even if the respondent is able to give an exact date thus making the period longer than 3 months (for example, if the activity above began on February 1 and ended on May 31, it continued for 4 months), the following subtraction formulas apply:
