b) Key achievements	For 2 and 4 ICPD issues the key achievements according to the National Action Plan for Environmental Education focused on Sustainable Development (SD) was the establishment of the network of Environmental Education Centres (EEC) and the implementation of Environmental Education Programs based on the environmental resources management, sustainable resource use and environmental degradation. Also, those programs involved actively the local populations and through the operation of the EEC, various targets of SD have been achieved such as: local sustainability of isolated communities, the use of local wisdom, the intergenerational communication and interaction, the sense of belonging and respecting the land. From 2004 till today more than 100.000 students had been involved in those programs with the active participation of local populations. In addition, in schools a series of various environmental education programs with emphasis to those issues were developed. Additionally, through the newly established curriculum for EE/ESD all schools through the thematic units of: forestry, biodiversity, use of the land, consumption and production, poverty etc, examined in depth those issues, with the aim of achieving specific learning outcomes from each thematic unit.
c) Facilitators*	For 2,3,4 ICPD issues the factors that contributed positively to the implementation actions are codes: 1, 2,3.
d) Barriers*	Not sufficient progress achieved given the strain already imposed on public finances. Acknowledging that this is an obligation towards EU, it is expected to be completed by 2012 with partial financing from Structural Funds. For 2,3,4 ICPD issues the barriers are code:11 (work within the bureaucracy). Additional barriers can be considered the lack of funding and the absence of legitimacy and institutional structures for the viability of all those actions (code: 99).

Issues regarding the interaction between population and development that should receive further public policy priority for the next five (5) to ten (10) years

Cyprus has set the following five national targets in the context of EU 2020 Strategy to be achieved by 2020:

- (a) Increase R&D expenditure to 0.50% of GDP
- (b) Reduce the dropout rate to 10% by 2020 from 11.9% in 2009. Increase the share of the population aged 30-34 having completed tertiary education to at least 46% by 2020 from 44.7% in 2009.
- (c) Achieve an increase of 14.3% in energy savings in the projected primary energy consumption by the year 2020. Reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 21% in the installations included in the Emissions Trading Systems (ETS) and by 5% for the sectors that are not included in the ETS. Increase of the contribution of renewable energy sources to 13% of the total energy consumption.
- (d) 75-77% of the population aged 20-64 should be employed.
- (e) Reduce the number of the people at risk of poverty and social exclusion by 27.000 people or decrease the percentage of people at risk of poverty and social exclusion from 22.2% in 2008 to 19.3% by 2020.
