Between September and the end of December 2012 a broad group of respondents was approached by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Multilateral Organisations and Human Rights Department. Many responses were received from various departments within Foreign Affairs and the Ministries of Health, Welfare & Sport, Social Affairs & Employment, Education, Culture & Science and Infrastructure & the Environment. A joint reply from a selection of Dutch-based CSOs was also received via Rutgers WPF (SRHR knowledge centre).

The following sections of the questionnaire were completed to the best of the respondents' knowledge: Section 1 on Population, Sustained Economic Growth and Sustainable Development, Section 2 on Population Growth and Structure, Section 3 on Urbanization and Internal Migration, Section 4 on International Migration and Development, Section 5 on Family, Wellbeing of Individuals and Societies, Section 6 on Reproductive Rights and Reproductive Health and Health, Morbidity and Mortality, Section 7 on Gender Equality, Equity and Empowerment of Women and Section 8 on Population, Development and Education.
