In Spain, the Migration Policy is distributed among several actors at the National, Regional and local level. The most important in the field of migration and development are some units concentrated in the Ministries of Employment, the Ministry of Interior and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation. The Ministry for Employment and Social Security (MEYSS), is one of the youngest Ministries in Spain (1920) and conducts and coordinates in Spain the migration policy since 2004. The compentent unit within the MEYSS is the Secretariat General for Immigration and Emigration (SGIE) created by decree in 2012, successor of the Secretary of State for Immigration and Emigration. The Ministry of Interior (MIR), created 1812, plays an important part in the migration policy regarding border management and control of foreigners on Spanish soil. It has several units responsible for important cooperation programmes with 3rd countries outside the EU, namely the Direction General for International Relations and Migration Affairs (decree of 2006), The Direction General of the National Police and the Direction General of the Civil Guard.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, created in 1714 plays, as the coordinator of the Spanish foreign policy as a whole, a major role in the coordination and design of the migration policy. It counts with several units for this purpose, the Spanish Agency for Development Cooperation (AECID), created in 1989, which funds the only specific programme for Migration and Development, the ECOWAS- Spain Fund for Migration and development, endowed with 10 million euros; the Directorate General for Spanish Nationals abroad, Consular and Migration Affairs, responsible for all multilateral and bilateral political dialogues on migration, and the Secretariat of State for the European Union, charged with the follow up of the migratory debates taking place within the framework of the Justice and Home affairs field.
