Agenda for the regional workshop on Sustainable Forest Management for Greener Economies in the Caucuses and Central Asian Region

Kazzhol Hotel, Astana, Kazakhstan, 8th to the 11th of April 2014

Globally governments have increased the pace of change towards more sustainable development through policies for greener economies. According to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), a green economy is low carbon, resource efficient, and socially inclusive. Unlocking the full potential of sustainable forestry can deliver a range of economic, social and ecological functions that play a key role in greening the economy. There are many opportunities from forestry related to increasing sources of renewable materials and energy, environmental services, more green jobs and improved livelihoods whilst enhancing biodiversity, water and soil. To fully realise the potential of forestry requires a responsive and inclusive forest sector, enabling policies and supportive institutions to help broaden opportunities related to forest management, products and services.

In October 2013, United Nations Economic Commission of Europe (UNECE) and the Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) launched a capacity development project which aims through training and policy advisory services to assist countries in the region develop context specific strategies to more fully harness the potential of sustainable forest management for greener economies. To launch this initiative a 3 day regional workshop has been organised for representatives from 7 target countries in Central Asia and the Caucasus, namely: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. The workshop will focus on a range of topics including;

- Principles of greener economies and sustainable forest management
- Stakeholder engagement in forest policy processes
- Forestry data gathering and management
- Bioenergy generation from wood
- Green economy action planning for country contexts and training delivery

Target audience: Those with influence over forestry decision making or implementation. For example policy makers and implementers from key government agencies including those focusing on forestry, but also from related sectors such as environment and nature protection, agriculture/grazing, energy and finance. In addition those from private sector, non-government organisations, training and academic institutions are welcome.

Expectations for participants: All participants must be available for the duration of the workshop. They must also be willing and able to support the replication /adaptation of this training workshop to their national context and as well as to support changes in forestry to further enhance sustainable forest management for greener economies.

Language and approach: Workshop is in English but with interpretation and materials provided in Russian. The workshop approach will be informal and interactive.
