II. Annotations and list of documents

1. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with Chapter III, Rule 7 of the Rules of Procedure (TRANS/WP.29/690 and Amend.1) of the World Forum for Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations (WP.29), the first item on the provisional agenda is the adoption of the agenda.

2. Regulation No. 107 (M_2 and M_3 vehicles)

(a) Proposals for further amendments

GRSG agreed to consider ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/14 submitted by the expert from Germany on new requirements for the main engine compartment door to prevent accidents.

GRSG may wish to consider a revised proposal submitted by the expert from Germany ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/15 on the minimum number of priority seats in vehicles of Classes III and B.

GRSG is expected to consider ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/16 tabled by the expert from Belgium proposing amendments to the safety prescriptions of trolleybuses to update the respective references to electrical standards.

GRSG agreed to resume consideration on ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/22 submitted by the expert from Germany to clarify the technical provisions for gangway barriers in vehicles of Classes I and A.

GRSG may wish to resume consideration on a proposal by Sweden on the performance and installation of automatic fire suppression systems in the engine compartment of buses and coaches, if available.

GRSG may also wish to consider another proposal from Germany clarifying the requirements for low floor vehicles and requiring the automatic activation of hazard warning lights in case of a detection of a temperature excess in the engine and/or heater compartment, if available.

(b) Requirements for service doors, windows and emergency exits

GRSG agreed to have a final review of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2013/100 and may wish to consider ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/17 proposing further amendments.

3. Regulation No. 18 (Anti-theft of motor vehicles)

GRSG agreed to consider ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/20 submitted by the expert from Germany on the clarification of the scope of the UN Regulation.

4. Regulation No. 34 (Prevention of fire risks)

GRSG agreed to resume consideration of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/4 prepared by the expert from Japan to improve the fire prevention of vehicles in case of a rear collision, and is expected to consider a revised text of this proposal, including further elements on cost and benefit and additional statistical data.

5. Regulation No. 43 (Safety glazing)

GRSG is expected to be informed by the Chair of the Informal Group on Plastic Glazing (IGPG) about the progress made by the group. GRSG may wish to consider a proposal by Germany to clarify the concern on the barometric pressure conditions required for the impact test, if available.

6. Regulation No. 46 (Devices for indirect vision)

GRSG agreed to keep ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2011/23/Rev.1 tabled by the Netherlands on behalf of the informal group on Camera Monitor Systems (CMS) on new provisions to replace all mirrors by camera monitoring systems awaiting the publication by ISO of ISO 16505 Standard.

GRSG agreed to resume consideration of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/21 and ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/23 from Germany on installation requirements of exterior mirrors with an automatic pivoting function and the clarification of the extended field of vision of heavy goods vehicles.

GRSG may wish to consider two proposals by the International Organization of Motor Vehicle Manufacturers (OICA) (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/18 and ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/19) on the clarification of transitional provisions of the 03 and the 04 series of amendments to the UN Regulation, respectively.

GRSG is expected to also consider a revised proposal by Japan (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/5) to improve the field of vision for drivers of larger vehicles, if available.

7. Regulation No. 58 (Rear underrun protection)

GRSG agreed to continue consideration of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/27 as a revised proposal by Germany introducing more stringent requirements for rear underrun protection devices.

8. Regulation No. 67 (LPG vehicles)

GRSG may wish to consider updated proposals by the expert from the European Association of Automotive Suppliers (CLEPA) for amendments to UN Regulation No. 67 regarding LPG fuel selection and "stop-start" valve control systems.

9. Regulation No. 110 (CNG vehicles)

GRSG agreed to consider in detail revised proposals by the expert from CLEPA to insert new provisions into UN Regulation No. 110 on electronic control units, fuel selection (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/25) and "stop-start" valve control systems for vehicle engines (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/2013/26) fuelled with compressed natural gas (CNG).
