

Main task: Support NHTSA in evaluation of ADB

NHTSA Project Scope

- Phase 1: test vehicles per ECE R48 and collect illuminance information at various points for an exposed vehicle using an instrumented 2nd vehicle (Oct-Dec 2013)
- Phase 2: Investigate quantitative approach to ADB assessment
- Phase 3: Try out the modified test procedure and evaluate objective data (Spring 2014)

SAE Standards & US Regulations

The National Technology Transfer and Advancement Act of 1995 (NTTAA)

NTTAA, Section 12(d):

Federal agencies "shall use technical standards that are developed or adopted by voluntary consensus standards bodies, using such technical standards as a means to carry out policy objectives or activities," except when an agency determines that such use "is inconsistent with applicable law or otherwise impractical."

White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB)

OMB created revised Circular A-119 in response to the enactment of the NTTAA

- Circular A-119, "Federal Participation in the Development and Use of Voluntary Consensus Standards and in Conformity Assessment Activities"
- Circular A-119 can be found at http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/circulars_a119/
 - February 19, 1998 version (63 Fed. Reg. 8546)
 - Currently under revision
