Development of the International Whole Vehicle Type Approval (IWVTA)

During the last 162nd WP29 (11-14 March 2014), the Chair of the IWVTA subgroup reported the progress of the Group in the document WP.29-162-12-Rev.1.

The latest version of the Regulation No. 0 is available in the document WP29-162-11.

The structure of the Regulation No.0 was presented and in addition two lists of UN Regulations that could be mandatory for obtaining a Whole Vehicle Type Approval.

• <u>List A</u> contained thirty-nine UN Regulations that could already be included in the first step of the partial IWVTA and included in the first version of UN R0. In the case of the GRPE, only the Regulation 85 (engine power) was considered.
