The text reproduced below was prepared by the expert from the International Motorcycle Manufacturers Association (IMMA) to allow the use of different brake lamp activation methods and to align the brake lamp provision with those applicable for four-wheelers. The modifications to the existing text of the Regulation are marked in bold for new or strikethrough for deleted characters.

## I. Proposal

Paragraph 2.5.9., amend to read:

"2.5.9. "Stop lamp" means the lamp used to indicate to other road-users to the rear of the vehicle that its driver is applying the service brake;. The stop lamps may be activated by the application of a retarder or a similar device;"

### II. Justification

- 1. This amendment proposes to clarify the definition of "Stop lamp" so that it would allow the use of different brake lamp activation methods for powered two-wheelers as currently applicable for four-wheelers.
- 2. The proposed new definition is aligned with the definitions in Regulations Nos. 7 and 48.
