1. Project title and project number: Improving the capacity of the UNECE member States to create green jobs in the forest sector

2. Expected timing/ duration: October 2017 – December 2019

3. Objective and brief summary of the project:

The overall objective of the project is to improve the capacity of the UNECE member States to create green jobs in the forest sector. Project activities will contribute to the implementation of the Rovaniemi Action Plan for the Forest Sector in a Green Economy. They will include:

A1.1. Preparation of a trend monitoring report on Green Forest Jobs;

A1.2. Preparation of an analysis of the trends and its implications including description of the major transformation drivers for the creation of green forest jobs, assessment of existing tools and examples, and mapping and description of present and future needed skill requirements for forestry professionals in the region;

A2.1. Preparation of a summary of the findings in the policy brief format for different groups of stakeholders; A2.2. Elaboration of the "Guidelines on Green Forest Jobs";

A2.3. Organisation of knowledge transfer workshop covering forests and health and optimal forest ecosystem functioning;

A2.4. Organisation of knowledge transfer workshop covering regional and land use development and wood and energy production.

4. Expected results of the project:

EA1.Improved knowledge of the UNECE member States on current transformation trends, drivers and requirements for stimulating green jobs in the forest sector

EA2. Enhanced capacity of policymakers and other stakeholders to develop evidence-based forest policies for green jobs and the empowerment of women in the forest sector in the context of the green economy and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (based on the proposed Green Forest Job framework).

5. Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

Beneficiary countries are all UNECE member States. The target group is mainly forest policy makers and forest managers. The results of this work is aimed also to benefit local communities and other forest stakeholders.

6. Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The project is linked to the Expected accomplishment (a) Improved monitoring and assessment of the forest sector, to support sustainable forest management of Subprogramme 7 "Forestry and Timber" of the UNECE proposed strategic framework for the period 2018-2019. The project supports the implementation of the UNECE-FAO Joint Integrated Programme of Work 2014-2017, which includes the promotion of green jobs in the forest sector Work Area 2: *Policy Dialogue and Advice* and the capacity-building activities on the contribution of the forest sector to a green economy under the Work Area 4 *Capacity-Building*. The mandate for the development of work on green jobs in the forest sector has been confirmed regularly by the member States by their involvement in the activities of the UNECE/FAO/ILO Team of Specialists on Green Jobs in the Forest Sector.
