Thank you for your e-mail from 24. December 2014 regarding transboundary environmental impact assessment procedure for the construction of nuclear reactors 3 and 4 at the Khmelnytskyi Nuclear Power Plant in Ukraine.

Let us inform you about current development of environmental impact assessment for above-mentioned activity in transboundary context.

At the end of 2013 Slovak Republic acceded to the possibility of carrying out consultations by e-mail. On 18. December 2013 was sent to the Ukrainian party the amount of 12 questions as a basis for written consultation (Annex No. 1). The Ukrainian party responded to questions by e-mail and by letter №5/1-13/2150-14 dated on 13. February 2014 (Annex No. 2).

After discussing the answers with the competent authorities of the Slovak Republic the Slovak party sent to Ukraine letter No. 2252/2015-3.4/hp (Annex No. 3) in which expressed thanks for the comments on the submitted questions. However all the questions have not been exhaustively answered by the competent authorities the Slovak party requested to be informed during the process of authorization and construction of nuclear power plant Khmelnitsky. Slovak party also required from Ukrainian party to subsequently present the missing information according to their availability during the various stages of the approval and construction process.
