Re: Communication to the Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee concerning compliance by the Czech Republic in connection with access to justice in particular (ACCC/C/2010/50)

On 14 June 2010, the secretariat of the Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation and Access to Justice (Aarhus Convention) received the above communication submitted by you and addressed to the Compliance Committee of the Convention regarding compliance by the Czech Republic with certain provisions of the Convention. The communication was submitted in accordance with the provisions of chapter VI of the annex to decision I/7 of the Meeting of the Parties.
