Thank you for your correspondence of 20 and 27 September 2011 regarding a request for information made to the Forestry Commission. Please accept my apologies for the delay in responding.

From the documentation you have sent it appears that you have made a request to the FCS but do not think that all of the information you requested has been released. You also doubt the accuracy of what has been provided by the FCS.

I should initially highlight that the Information Commissioner cannot look into the veracity or accuracy of the information – our sole remit is to determine whether the information held by the public authority has been provided.
