Subject: Re: ACCC 89 - the answer from UJD on our request to give access to information in Bratislava

Dear members of the Compliance Committee,

Please, find in the attachment the translation of the two documents I sent you during the hearing session to prove on request of Mr. Jendroska that Greenpeace formally asked to have access to the documentation at the offices of UJD in Bratislava instead of in Mochovce and the rejection by UJD.

As you can see from the latter, our request was rejected on purely formal grounds, in spite of the fact that our Energy Campaigner Pavol Siroky has been over the years in contact with UJD and that UJD was aware of the fact that he was working for Greenpeace. In case of doubt they could, of course, have made one telephone call to get confirmation - this would have saved them the half hour or more of writing these rejection paragraphs. None of my submissions in earlier procedures, nor any made by Mr. Siroky's predecessor has ever been rejected on these grounds.

I have to rectify one issue I mentioned during the hearing. I had asked Mr. Siroky also to ask UJD also for access to a digital copy of the documentation, but he forgot doing that and I was not aware of that. This means that UJD also not formally refused us access to digital copies of the information. Nevertheless, given the amount of material, access to digital copies (downloadable from the internet or by email) is during EIA procedures the normal way of giving access to information. And it would have been a practical way to give access to the public for those that were not able to make the travel to Mochovce. Also, it is recognisable in the black-outing and white-outing of what UJD considered "sensitive" information, that this has been done in an electronic way, which means that either the developer or UJD had electronic copies of the material at its disposal.
