The EIA (in Britain) depends on the relevant British provisions, which has to implement European specifications. As part of the autonomous assessment, that the project will have no serious impact to the neighbor states. Following there has been neither notifying by Britain of the neighbor states of France and Ireland, nor of any other member state of the European Union. According to Article 37 of Euratom Treaty Britain furthermore provided to EU Commission on 9th of August 2011 the general information of the emissions of radioactive materials from the two planned PR reactors of Hinkley Point C. The European Commission made in their statement (OJ 33/1 page 1 from 7-2-2012) the conclusion that the plans of the emission of any radioactive materials from the two planned PR reactors of Hinkley Point C neither in normal operation nor in case of accident considered in the general information of the type and magnitude cause a health significantly contamination of water, earth or air.

The German Government sees no reason, to doubt about the evaluation carried out by the relevant British authority and the European Commission about the project of Hinkley Point C.
