The Food Safety and Inspection Service in Suwałki (in response to the document from the residents of Bakałarzewo municipality referring to the disagreement of building the electrical power lines with a voltage of 2x400kV ) informs that at the present stage (coordination dealing with the adopting of the local spatial development plan) cannot question the building of the power lines with a voltage of 2x400kV.

Currently there is no study concerning the potential arduousness or the harmfulness connected with building of the electrical power lines with a voltage of 2x400kV that you protest against. This kind of line according to the Act of the Council of Ministers 9 November 2010 (concerning the investments that can be harmful to the life and environment- *J. o L.* 2013 item 1397) can be a part of investments that can be harmful to the life and environment. Therefore it is essential to conduct the environmental impact assessment and to prepare the report of the environmental impact that allows the State Sanitary Inspection responding to it. Currently there is no basis (apart from the fear of the residents of Bakałarzewo municipality that is not supported by any documents confirming the environmental impact) to question the building of the electrical power lines with a voltage of 2x400kV.

For the reason that the State Sanitary Inspection is established to protect the health from the harmful and burdensome factors the planned investment will be checked and assessed regarding to it at the next stages of investment.

The impact of the electrical power lines with a voltage of 2x400kV on the loss of tourism and natural values and the potential loss of the values of properties will not be taken into consideration, as this is not the responsibility of the State Sanitary Inspection.
