Re: Communication to the Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee concerning compliance by Greece concerning access to justice for permits granted or extended by legislative acts (ACCC/C/2014/148)

On 3 August 2017, the secretariat of the Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters (Aarhus Convention) received from you the above communication addressed to the Compliance Committee of the Convention. The communication concerns compliance by Greece with the provisions of the Convention in connection with its alleged failure to provide for access to justice in relation to the granting or extension of certain permits for power plants by way of legislative acts. The communication was submitted in accordance with the provisions of chapter VI of the annex to decision I/7 of the Meeting of the Parties.
