

Within 2 years of becoming a Party, each country sets and publishes targets, and dates for achieving them

Parties:

- collect and evaluate data
- publish results
- review progress
- provide summary reports

MOP evaluate progress in implementation

Progress under the Protocol

- 25 countries have ratified
- 8 countries have set targets, several are in the process of setting them.
- Focus areas 2010 -12:
 - Target setting and reporting
 - Small scale water supply and sanitation
 - Equitable access
- Second reporting cycle will take place spring 2013



Ongoing cooperation

- The Protocols program of work 2010 13
 - Target setting exchange of experience
 - Extreme weather events. Guidance document "Guidance on water supply and sanitation in extreme weather events" published 2011.
 - Promotion of the Protocol "How to better promote the Convention and its Protocol on Water and Health: a guide for focal points"
- The EU Water Initiative and NPD
- The Chairs of the two instruments participate at the other instruments bureau meetings.

Possible areas for future cooperation

- The EU Water Initiative and NPD (Program area B).
- Quantifying the benefits of transboundary cooperation. (Program area c)
- Climate change Need for transboundary cooperation in climate change adaptation is increasingly recognized, also at UNFCCC and EU. (Program area D)
- The water-food-energy-ecosystems nexus (Program area E)
- Continue exploring the relation between the work of the convention on monitoring and assessment and the setting of targets and target dates according to article 6 and reviewing progress and reporting according to article 7 of the Protocol.
