

HOW THE UN SYSTEM SUPPORTS TRANSBOUNDARY WATER COOPERATION

Approximately 40% of the world's population lives in river basins that cross the borders of two or more countries and, even more significantly, over 90% of the world's population lives within countries that share these basins. The protection, equitable and sustainable use of transboundary water resources – both surface and groundwater – is thus key to development and security. The 2013 International Year of Water Cooperation will further underscore the importance of transboundary cooperation.

What is the UN system doing to address the challenges of shared water resources? How does it alleviate related tensions around the globe? And how does it support countries' cooperation? What is planned for 2013? Which role does UN-Water play in this and in the follow-up to Rio+20?

The side event will address these questions by presenting and discussing the efforts of a number of UN agencies on cooperation on transboundary waters.
