## 1. Brief History







- IPCC Expert Meeting in Dakar (1998) identified the four approaches for HWP reporting/accounting
- 2001 (SBTA 14) countries submitted their view on HWP accounting
- 2003: Good Practice Guidance for Land Use, Land-Use Change and Forestry (LULUCF) presented practical tools (methodologies) for reporting accounting
- 2004: Workshop in Lillehammer, Norway: Assessment each approach was needed to support any future decision
- 2004-2007: further discussion, countries reported on their reporting experiences on HWP
- 2008: AWG-KP is considering including accounting for HWP for post-Kyoto Protocol



## 2. Geneva HWP Workshop







- 9-10 Sep 2008, Geneva
  - Organized by UNECE, FAO, Switzerland, MCPFE
- 100 participants: scientists, forest and climate policy-makers, eNGOs and industry
- Lively discussion, leading to the Chair's Conclusions & Recommendations



## 2. HWP Workshop – Conclusions I

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- 4. HWP accounting methods improve the accuracy of GHG balances compared to the IPCC default approach.
  - difference between approaches is to whom the responsibility for the carbon emissions from HWP is assigned (trade)



- 1. Substitution effect of HWP is key impact
- 2. Carbon stock in HWP has been (and is) increasing significantly
- 3. Existing data can be used to calculate HWP
  - Reporting on HWP will eventually lead to improved data on HWP

## 2. HWP Workshop – Conclusions II







- 5. Time schedule: proposal needed by mid 2009 (for a potential agreement in Copenhagen in December 2009)
- 6. Accounting for HWP can be an incentive for harvesting (and silvicultural measures)
  - which could lower this risk from natural disturbance in certain areas
- Accounting for HWP can be an incentive to use wood as material before using it for energy generation ("cascade" principles)
- 8. Consumers and the general public are often not aware of the role of HWP in GHG balance




#### 2. HWP Workshop – Recommendations I









- 2. Coordination between climate change and forest sector (and within forest sector)
- 3. International organizations should work together to improve and harmonize reporting on forests and forest products
- Simple, but feasible (data & methodology)accounting approaches for HWP should be preferred to sophisticated solutions, which are difficult to implement
- 5. Accounting for HWP or incentives to increase the use of wood must not compromise sustainable forest management domestically or in other countries.



#### 2. HWP Workshop – Recommendations II









- 6. Some participants advocated that the following principles would be appropriate to apply:
  - a) HWP reporting to be consistent with LULUCF reporting
  - b) If countries elect forest management they should also be able to account for HWP in order not to penalize forest management in the future.
  - c) Countries choosing to account for HWP should also account for forest management in order not to compromise sustainable forest management.
  - d) If HWP is accounted for in the future, countries have to ensure that the imports that they account for come from sustainable sources to avoid perverse incentives.

#### 2. HWP Workshop – Recommendations III







- 8. Governments, with the participation of all stakeholders, should take the lead to develop policies and strategies to strengthen the "cascaded" use of wood.
- 9. Governments and sectoral associations should cooperate to communicate the benefits of wood use to consumers and the general public.
