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INTRODUCTION

1. The present document has been prepared by the secretariat on the basis of the proceedings of the ad hoc expert group on the draft annex 8 to the "Harmonization" Convention (Geneva, 22 September 2003). The report summarizes the presentations made, the views expressed and the conclusions drawn during the meeting. The purpose of this report is to provide a basis for further work to be undertaken concerning this issue by the Working Party.

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ATTENDANCE

The session was attended by representatives from the following countries: Austria; Belgium; 2. Croatia; Czech Republic; Finland; Germany; Greece; Hungary; Lithuania; Netherlands; Portugal; The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia; Slovakia; Sweden; Switzerland; Turkey; United Kingdom and United States of America. Representatives of the European Community (EC) were

also present.

CONSIDERATION OF THE NEW DRAFT ANNEX 8 TO THE CONVENTION

The Expert Group recalled that a number of the provisions contained in the new draft 5.

Annex 8 to the Convention were still outstanding in particular Article 2 concerning visa issues,

Article 4 concerning vehicle inspection and finally Article 5 concerning the International Vehicle

Weight Certificate.

6. The Expert Group in general seemed to be of the view that the proposed texts concerning all

outstanding issues seemed to be acceptable with some minor modifications. Germany reserved its

position, in particular, in relation to Articles 2 and 5.

CONCLUSIONS

7. The Expert Group recommended that the secretariat prepare a consolidated version of the

proposal for a new draft Annex 8 to the Convention and convene the sixth session of the Administrative Committee of the "Harmonization" Convention in February 2004 in conjunction with

the one-hundred-and-sixth session of the Working Party on Customs Questions affecting Transport

(WP.30).
