Improving motorcycle safety

Revised Questionnaire on Motorcycle Safety Policies and Programmes

A. <u>Introduction</u>

Motorcyclists are an established, significant and growing part of the vehicle/driver mix world-wide. Motorcyclist deaths and injuries are a matter of social concern. Motorcyclists are exposed/vulnerable to particular human, vehicle and environmental accident risk factors.

This questionnaire was developed by the Special Work Group on Improving Motorcycle Safety, set up during the 43rd session of the UNECE Working Party on Road Traffic Safety.

The purpose of this questionnaire is to collect information on current government activities related to improving motorcycle safety, so that future work can be developed on harmonising legislation and making best practices available to countries seeking additional ideas. Further information is available in UN/ECE Document **TRANS/WP.1/2003/16**, Improving Motorcycle Safety.

B. Explanation

• A motorcycle is a two-wheeled vehicle with either an engine capacity of more than 50cc or a maximum design speed > 50 km/h
