## Proposal for amendments to Regulation No. 107

## Submitted by the expert from the International Organization of Motor Vehicle Manufacturers *

The text reproduced below was prepared by the expert from the International Organization of Motor Vehicle Manufacturers (OICA) to base the required number of priority seats in vehicles of Class I upon the floor surface available for passengers. It is based on informal document No. GRSG-99-12 distributed at the ninety-ninth session of the Working Party on General Safety Provisions (GRSG). The modifications to the current text of the Regulation are marked in bold for new or strikethrough for deleted characters.

## I. Proposal

Annex 3, paragraph 7.7.8.5.3., amend to read:
"7.7.8.5.3. The minimum number of priority seats complying with the requirements of Annex 8, paragraph 3.2. shall be: be four in Class I, two in Class II and one in Class A.
(a) in vehicles of Class I:
(i) one if the surface So is less than or equal to $15 \mathbf{m}^{\mathbf{2}}$;
(ii) two if the surface $S o$ is greater than $15 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ but less than $\mathbf{2 0} \mathrm{m}^{2}$;
(iii) four if the surface $S o$ is equal to or greater than $20 \mathrm{~m}^{\mathbf{2}}$;
(b) in vehicles of Class II:
(i) one if the surface So is less than or equal to $15 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$;
(ii) two if the surface $S o$ is greater than $15 \mathbf{~ m}^{2}$;
(c) one in vehicles of Class $A$.

A seat that folds out of the way when not in use shall not be designated as a priority seat."

## II. Justification

1. The existing requirements for the number of priority seats severely penalises small vehicles of Class I. Class A vehicles having 22 passengers are required to have only 1 priority seat, while the same vehicles with a slightly different interior layout having 23 passengers, thus Class I vehicles, are required to have 4 priority seats, in addition to a wheelchair space.
2. Paragraph 7.2.2.3. of Annex 3 specifies the number of required seating places according to the floor area available for passengers and crew and it is considered appropriate to specify in paragraph 7.7 .8 .5 .3 . the number of required priority seats on the same basis.
