

PARISTAN: ACCESSION

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The above action was effected on 21 July 2015, with:

Reservation (Original: English)

"The Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan declares, in terms of Article 58 of the Convention," that it would not be bound by the provisions of Article 57, paragraphs 2 to 6 of the Convention."

The Convention will enter into force for Pakistan on 21 January 2016 in accordance with its article 53 (2) which reads as follows:

"After five States referred to in article 52, paragraph 1, have signed it without reservation of ratification, exceptance or approval, or have deposited their instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession, this Convention shall enter into force for further Contracting Parties six months after the date of the denoist of their instruments of ratification, acceptance approval or accession."

Pending further notification by the Government of the People's Republic of China, the 1975 Convention on the International Transport of Goods shall not apply within the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and the Macao Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of

The Convention will enter into force for China on 5 January 2017 in accordance with its article


