### Latest Developments in Vehicle Regulations

- 5 New UN Regulations (1958 Agreement)
  - Quiet road transport vehicles
  - Brake assist systems
  - Electronic stability control
  - Tyre pressure monitoring system
  - Heavy duty dual fuel engine retrofit systems
- 85 Amendments to existing UN Regulations -1958 Agreement
- 2 New UN Global Technical Regulations (1998 Agreement)
  - Crankcase and evaporate emissions from powered two an three wheelers
  - OBD for powered two- and three-wheelers
- 2 Amendments to UN GTRs No.15 (WLTP) and No.16 (Tyres) 1998 Agreement
- New Special Resolution S.R.2 (Strengthening implementation of the 1998 Agreement) and new Resolution on light sources







#### **Latest Developments in Vehicle** Regulations (cont.)

- Automated driving functions
  - Proposals for UN Regulation on first automated driving functions adopted by GRRF
  - Speed limit of 10 km/h will be abolished in R79



- Cyber-security
- Guidelines on **Cyber Security** and Data Protection
- Over-the-air-update/connectivity
  - «in-vehicle» and «extended vehicle» connectivity task force


## Latest Developments in Vehicle Regulations (cont.)



- Revision 3 of 1958 Agreement
  - Consensus reached at the level of WP.29
  - Notification process initiated (EiF expected 14 Sept 2017)
  - Basis for International Whole Vehicle Type Approval (IWVTA)

#### Type Approval Database DETA

- Requested by Rev. 3 of the 1958 Agreement
- Pre-requisit for functioning of IWVTA
- Financing not possible under current RB
- Open window under PBIs regime
- Looking for temporary solution to start...







# Latest Developments in Vehicle Regulations (cont.)



- Type Approval Database DETA (cont.)
  - Interim solution proposal under review by

#### Informal Working Group on DETA:

- no affect on principal decision to finance DETA on the regular UNECE Budget (long term)
- objective to shorten time until DETA is available to Contracting Parties
- establish a Trust Fund to allocate budget for DETA (common procedure within UN system)
- investigation by several countries and authorities of the possibility for contributing the funding for DETA's start-up
- funding by any other organization welcome (in compliance with UN finance rules)
- governance via advisory board, steering committee, secretariat and administrative agent
- Trust Fund under authority of the World Forum for Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations
