The Global Assessment in Belarus was started, and should be finished in early 2020. The Global Assessment in Kyrgyzstan is underway, with the first mission scheduled for January 2020, subject to funding. The Global Assessment in Turkmenistan is under discussion with the UN country team and the national statistical office.</p>

4	<p><b>Within its mandate, working together with other international organisations, as well as the local UNDP office in Ashgabat, [UNECE] to continue making efforts and to find ways to bring State Statistics Committee of Turkmenistan (Turkmenstat) more into international initiatives in order to ensure more active participation of Turkmenistan in international cooperation and especially participation of representatives from SSC Turkmenistan in international and sub-regional workshops, seminars and other type of capacity building events as well as in future similar projects.</b></p>	<p>UNECE accepts the recommendation.</p> <p>UNECE will continue to engage with Turkmenstat and the UN country team in Turkmenistan to encourage greater involvement of Turkmenstat in international statistical activities.</p> <p>As capacity development activities are strictly demand-driven, follow-up activities will depend on requests from Turkmenistan. However, UNECE will continue to seek ways to fund participants from Turkmenistan to attend relevant international meetings, and will use events such as the annual UNECE / Eurostat / EFTA High-level Seminar for EECCA countries (the 2019 seminar is on 24-26 September in Chisinau) to engage with senior managers from Turkmenstat to try to identify capacity development priorities.</p>	<p>Regional Adviser on Statistics</p>	<p>December 2021</p>	<p><b>In progress</b></p> <p>The UNECE Regional Adviser in Statistics met a representative of the UN country team for Turkmenistan in November 2019, and discussed how to increase the engagement of the national statistical office in international activities. The UN country team agreed to advocate with the Turkmen government for a Global Assessment of the National Statistical System</p> <p>UNECE secured funding from our partner, Eurostat, for senior representatives from the Turkmen statistical office to attend the joint UNECE / Eurostat / EFTA High-Level Seminar on Statistical Capacity Development for EECCA countries in Chisinau, Moldova, in September 2019. They identified the forthcoming population census, the use of geospatial information in electronic maps, the development of statistical registers, and filling SDG data gaps related to violence against women and use of Information and communication technology.</p>
