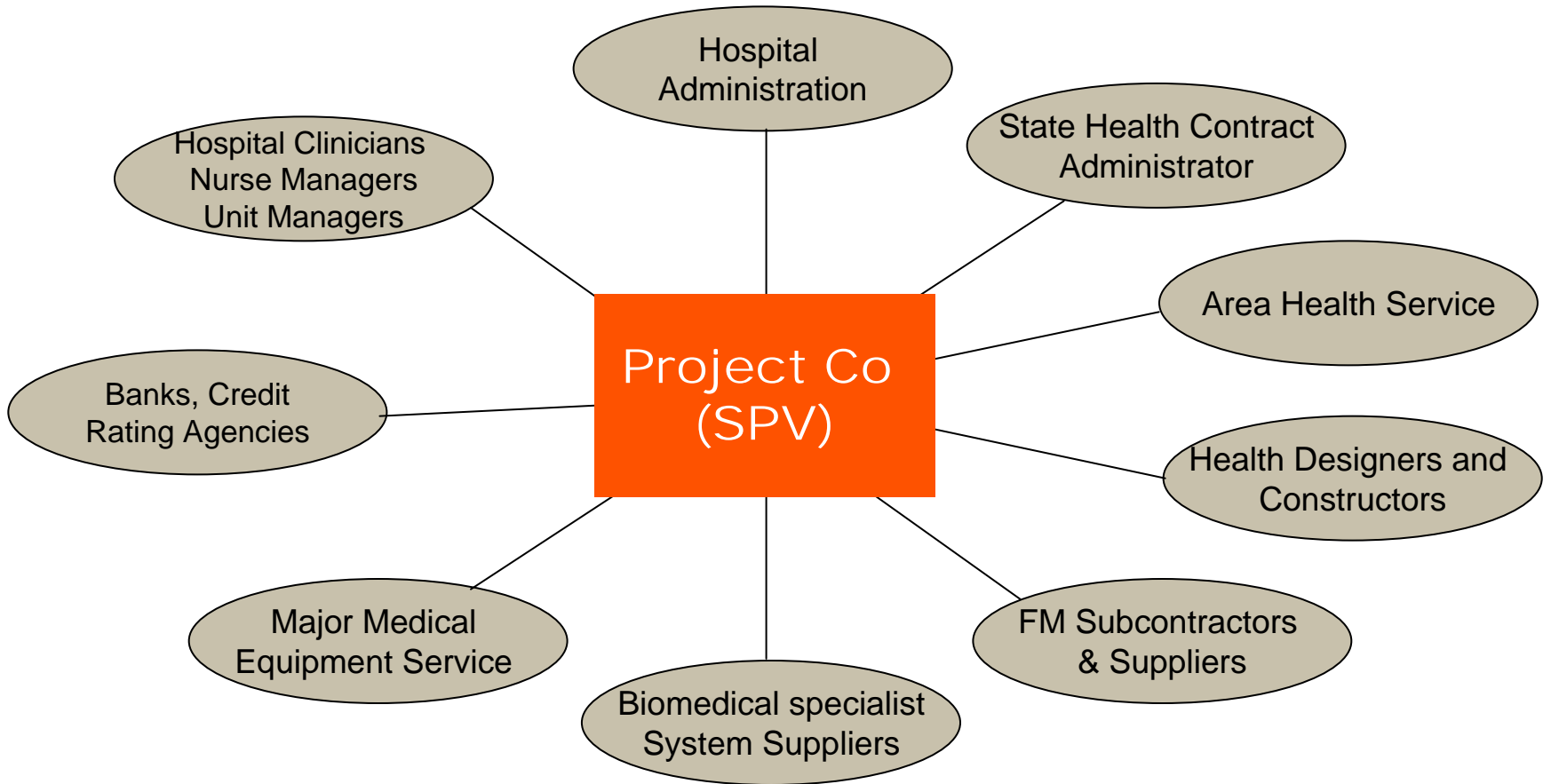

Key Issues to be dealt with in the modules

- The building services / clinical services split
 - Public perceptions: reinforcing that the core services are always retained by the Public Sector
 - Operational issues: recent research has suggested that PPPs can increase the division between these two functions¹

- Stakeholder management in hospital PPPs are critical – multiple interfaces
