Authors' Workshop: Regional Profiles & Reports

# Purpose of Regional Profiles and Reports

1. Provide important context and interpretation of GTF results at regional and national level – what does the data really mean?
2. Give countries an opportunity to showcase complimentary information – to explain GTF results, update data, or provide alternative points of view
3. Understand the capabilities and challenges for collecting energy data in regions and countries – and set the agenda for capacity-building
4. Disseminate GTF at a regional level and increase resulting dialogue with national policymakers

## Regional Profiles

- Maximum 10 pages per profile, including sub-regional analysis
- All commissions' profiles will be combined into stand-alone chapter in official 2017 GTF
- Will primarily use data visualizations from standardized set of options (with room for 1-2 individualized)
- Text will follow high-level standardized template of headings but each commission will choose messages and draft narrative
- Each commission will provide draft to WB
- Final version will be finalized jointly between the two organizations – WB will maintain final editorial control to ensure consistency with rest of GTF

# Regional Reports

- Longer, stand-alone publications for each region
- Will more deeply explore themes identified in the regional profile narrative
- Will include substantial individualized graphics/analysis and more detail about high priority countries
- Will include assessment of energy data collection capabilities and challenges in the region
- Each report should have similar structure of chapters (to be agreed this week), but messages and analysis will largely be unique
- Reports will be fully authored and published by each commission

# Data Interpretation Workshops

Each commission will facilitate one (or more) workshops to get input from national governments

Purpose of workshop:

- ✓ Ensure awareness of regional and national data and key regional messages
- ✓ Improve understanding of GTF methodologies at national level
- ✓ Collect country-specific input to validate data as needed
- ✓ Take stock of data collection/validation capacities and needs

# Respective Roles

## Regional Commissions

- Agree on standardized profile template and data together with World Bank
- Identify key regional/sub-regional results, messages, and data interpretation
- Organize data interpretation workshops and incorporate results into profiles and report
- Provide draft regional profile and jointly finalize with WB
- Author and independently publish full regional report

## World Bank

- Provide raw country data and standardized graphics
- Agree on standardized profile template and data together with commissions
- Review draft regional profile and jointly finalize with commissions
- Incorporate regional profiles into GTF and write regional comparison section
- Review products and provide guidance as needed for harmonization across regions

# Workshop objectives and format

## Objectives

- ❖ Review and discussing the primary indicators and key data that will be included in the summary regional profiles
- ❖ identify trends in the data or important regional/country context to be included in regional profiles and explore further in regional reports
- ❖ Identify any areas that might be sensitive or problematic and need further review
- ❖ Finalize plans for data interpretation workshop

## Format

Each commission will present its own data in 40 minute slots

Include selection of preliminary results; additional complimentary information; suggestions for narratives and full report; plans for data interpretation workshop
