



- The UNFC captures how recoverable and in place quantities are related to projects of various industrial maturity, economic viability and social/environmental acceptability.
- It is developed for:
  - Policy formulation
  - Government Resources management
  - Industrial business process management
  - Capital allocation



## **UNFC** benefits



- Structured framework of principles, rules and guidelines.
- Aligned to major international and national classification systems.
- Provides simplicity without sacrificing completeness or flexibility.
- Leverages global communications.
- Numerical and language independent coding scheme.
- Applicable for classifying, managing and reporting mineral, petroleum, renewable energy, anthropogenic resources and injection projects.

- The UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) has mandated the UNECE to develop and maintain the UNFC.
- UNECE covers the Northern hemisphere (56 Member states).
- UNECE cooperates closely with the other 4 Regional Commissions and UN ECOSOC.
