Page 4, paragraph 1, line 5

The third sentence should read

For example, the policy for waste management defined in the first NEAP (1996) of The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia was further developed in the second NEAP of 2006 and in the 2006 National Waste Management Plan in order to comply with EU waste management practices.

Page 5, paragraph 4, line 2

The second sentence should read

For example, a number of them have adopted laws in line with EU practices, such as the laws on Environmental Protection, Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control (IPPC),

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA).

Page 5, paragraph 4, line 10

The sixth sentence should read

Though EIA has been a primary target of legal drafting activities in recent years, in a few reviewed countries there was still no applicable EIA system in place for the simple reason that procedural details have not been regulated (e.g. Bosnia and Herzegovina).

Page 5, paragraph 6, line 9

Delete For example, the current legal basis in The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia provides only for a partial implementation of the UNECE Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making, and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters (Aarhus, 1998). New national legislation has been drafted to address this issue.
