

Water governance through an IWRM approach is the key entry point for progress on water-related SDGs.



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- We will work with countries to help identify priorities and formulate appropriate responses to water resources management challenges in the context of all the water-related SDGs (focusing on SDG 6.5.1 and 6.5.2) and national development more broadly.
- We will leverage countries' commitment to strengthening their water resources management capacity under SDG 6.5, as a pivot for progress.

Water solutions for the SDGs: Proposed activities

- We mobilize**
- Work with countries towards achieving SDG 6.5 through continued and coordinated assessment processes (together with i.a. UN Environment-DHI Centre and UNDP Cap-Net, **UNECE, UNESCO**).
 - Within specific Water-Intersections, establish new alliances and support new conversations between water and non-water actors.
- We act**
- Facilitate processes to prioritise key water-related actions on governance, management, and infrastructure, with the goal to advance the broad SDG agenda; support the design and implementation of action plans for these.
- We learn**
- Instigate learning through assessments of the value of water to decision making across SDG-related priorities.
 - Sharing lessons learnt on IWRM implementation.




- **Stage 1 - Identifying challenges**
Strengthening SDG 6.5 national monitoring and reporting
 - *Support SDG 6.5.1 monitoring in 36 countries between 2017 and 2018. Established baseline data for IWRM, as well as its implementation challenges.*
 - *Support Regional capacity building initiatives to strengthen and improve SDG 6.5.2 monitoring in 2018*

Key findings of 2018 status report on implementation of IWRM in Africa : UNEP / AMCOW



- Central Africa is the only sub region with a low level of IWRM implementation (28). All other sub regions have a medium-low level of IWRM implementation (scores between 37 and 50).
- Apart from Central Africa, each sub region has countries with medium-high implementation.
- **IWRM implementation in Central Africa should be a priority.**

- **Stage 2 - Formulating responses**

Helping countries design responses to SDG 6.5 and water-related goals

- ***Support countries in design of priority IWRM interventions for next three years until 2022 (ongoing)***
- ***Support regions in identification of priority activities to improve transboundary cooperation (2019)***

- **Stage 3 - Implementing solutions**

Supporting countries to implement solutions aimed at achieving SDG 6.5 and water-related goals

- ***Support National Water Policy elaboration and review process in countries;***
- ***Support process to elaborate National IWRM Action Plan in countries***
- ***Support establishment of multi-stakeholder platforms for water resources management***

SDG IWRM Support program 2020 Activities



- **Stage 1**: Supporting **60 countries** in reporting on their updated status of SDG 6.5.1 through multi-stakeholder workshops
- **Stage 2**: Supporting **20 countries** in planning their national IWRM action and investment plans
- **Stage 3**: Supporting **4+ pilot countries** in implementing their national IWRM action and investment plans: Ghana, Guatemala, Kazakhstan and Viet Nam

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS FROM SDG 6.5.2 (2018) AND TRANSBOUNDARY WATER COOPERATION (2019) WORKSHOPS IN CENTRAL AFRICA

- **Facilitate coordinated monitoring and reporting of SDG 6.5.1 and SDG 6.5.2 :**
 - *Improve effectiveness and efficiency*
 - *Focal Point often same individual*
 - *SDG 6.5.1 have 5 questions that are directly linked to transboundary water resources management.*
 - *Include organisation of a stakeholder workshop in preparation process for SDG 6.5.2 monitoring report.*
- **Mobilise financial resources to support SDG 6.5.2 Focal Points in reporting process:**
 - *Mobilise necessary information*
 - *Organise stakeholder workshop for quality assurance and increased ownership and uptake by national SDG team*
- **Strengthen efforts to build capacity of national SDG 6.5.2 Focal Points in elaboration of monitoring reports :**
 - *Organise regional training workshops on transboundary water resources management*

- **Within the framework of the process for organization and preparation of the next monitoring report, countries should:**
 - *Identify and facilitate designation of a key person and institution responsible for coordinating the process of elaboration of the report;*
 - *Identify key stakeholders who should be involved in reporting process, and who could also serve as potential sources of information;*
 - *Develop an indicative timetable for reporting ;*
 - *Communicate with riparian states to exchange information or coordinate responses => role of joint bodies and regional organizations;*
 - *Capitalise the first monitoring report (and that of its riparian countries) ;*
 - *Communicate and exchange with custodian agencies for advice, questions, and quality control of draft report.*

- **Ensure the integration of the results of the SDG 6.5.2 monitoring process into the national SDG progress report by strengthening communication with the national SDG monitoring team.**
 - *This is critical to leveraging financing for transboundary or cross-border cooperation;*
- **Improve knowledge on transboundary aquifers in Central Africa:**
 - *Continue the work of setting up and operationalizing the regional platform for hydrogeology experts in Central Africa;*
- **Strengthen exchange and sharing of data and information on water :**
 - *Continue ECCAS work on strengthening National Meteorological and Hydrological Services (NMHSs) in Central Africa*

CONCLUSIONS

- **Important to strengthen alignment between the efforts to monitor and advance SDG Indicators 6.5.1 and 6.5.2 at national level :**
 - Indicators 6.5.1 and 6.5.2 inform each other.
 - All 5 issues relating to transboundary water management in 6.5.1 provide information that complements 6.5.2.
- **Ensure coordination between all levels and sectors :**
 - Integration between levels and across sectors is key to ensuring that resources go where they are most needed and can be most effective in the SDG Agenda;
 - Ensure alignment between the monitoring process for SDG Target 6.5 indicators within the national SDG monitoring process.
