## **Report on contributions and expenditures in relation to the implementation of the Convention's work programmes for 2015–2017 and 2018–2021**

### **Note by the secretariat**

#### *Summary*

The present report was prepared pursuant to the decision of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters at its sixth session (Budva, Montenegro, 11–13 September 2017) (see ECE/MP.PP/2017/2/Add.1, decision VI/6, para. 9). It provides an overview of the contributions and expenditures in relation to the implementation of the work programme of the Convention for 2015–2017 for the period 1 January to 31 December 2017. It also provides information on the status of contributions and expenditures up to 16 March 2018 in relation to the implementation of the 2018–2021 work programme.

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## I. General considerations

1. The present report provides an overview of contributions and expenditures for the implementation of the work programme for 2015–2017 for the Convention on Access to Information, Public Participation in Decision-making and Access to Justice in Environmental Matters (Aarhus Convention) (ECE/MP.PP/2014/2/Add.1, decision V/6, annex I) for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2017. It also provides information on the status of contributions and expenditures in relation to the implementation of the 2018–2021 work programme for the Convention (ECE/MP.PP/2017/2/Add.1, decision VI/5, annex I) up to 16 March 2018.<sup>1</sup> During the reporting period (i.e., 1 January 2017–16 March 2018), the secretariat continued to observe a high degree of caution in its allocation of resources, mainly owing to the fact that many contributions were not yet available at the beginning of the financial year, thus creating uncertainty as to the availability of sufficient funds. The secretariat made various efforts to encourage in-kind contributions and thereby reduce the impact on the trust fund. The secretariat will continue pursuing synergies with other United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) multilateral environmental agreements, United Nations agencies and other partners in order to maintain a satisfactory number of activities and share implementation costs.

2. For the sustainability of the work under the Convention, it is crucial to ensure staff funding on a long-term basis. The extension of contracts for staff funded from the Aarhus Convention trust fund depends on the availability and the level of contributions received. Since the current financial scheme is based on voluntary contributions and provides no guidance on their amount, the level of contributions fluctuates, making the funding of extrabudgetary posts unpredictable and far from secure. As for the previous years, the secretariat was therefore obliged to give priority to securing funds for staff costs, which need to be reserved for at least one year before issuing a staff contract. The secretariat was able to allocate sufficient funds for staff and for activities in the reporting period only owing to savings accumulated at the end of each preceding year.

3. To ensure the continuity of work and effective delivery on commitments, the secretariat regularly had to reconsider the distribution of tasks among its staff members to guarantee the timely delivery of work when there were competing priorities.<sup>2</sup>

4. As of 1 February 2016, the temporary arrangement according to which the funding of one administrative staff member through the 13 per cent programme support costs levied from the trust funds of the ECE Environment Division has been discontinued. This staff member is required in order to provide the necessary administrative support to activities under the Aarhus Convention and its Protocol on Pollutant Release and Transfer Registers, including administrative arrangements for the meetings of the governing and subsidiary bodies of the two treaties. In order to ensure implementation of the work programme without any interruption, the secretariat recruited an administrative staff member to be funded through extrabudgetary resources.

<sup>2</sup> Following the departure of a P-2 staff member in August 2014, the post was temporarily occupied by a short-term staff member until the formal recruitment procedure for a fixed-termed P-2 staff member was completed in May 2015. A P-3 staff member, funded through extrabudgetary resources, left the secretariat in August 2016 and a P-2 staff member, whose position is funded through regular budgetary resources, was on temporary leave until 28 February 2017. As a result, temporary personnel were recruited at the P-2 and P-1 levels to take over the relevant tasks, including the preparations for and servicing of the latest sessions of the Convention's and Protocol's Meetings of the Parties in September 2017. The recruitment procedure for a P-3 fixed-term staff member funded through extrabudgetary resources is currently pending.

## II. Contributions

5. The “adjusted contribution” columns in tables 1 and 2 below are intended to offer a more realistic picture of the actual resources available for use in a given year. Contributions by Parties and signatories are often intended for use in a year other than the year the contribution was deposited and/or received. The adjusted contribution figure in a given year is derived from the actual contribution in that year, minus any part of that contribution that was intended for use in a different year, plus any contributions made in years other than the reference year but intended for use in the reference year. Owing to the lack of timely funding for any specific year, the secretariat is obliged to use the available funds, as necessary. Amounts presented in all the tables are rounded to whole numbers.

## B. In-kind contributions

6. The following in-kind contributions were made in the reporting period:<sup>3</sup>

(a) Support from the Government of Montenegro for the organization and hosting of the sixth session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Aarhus Convention, the third session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Protocol, the Joint High-level Segment and the associated preparatory meetings (Budva, Montenegro, 10–15 September 2017);

(b) Support from the Office of the United Nations Development Programme in Montenegro for the organization of the sessions of the Meetings of the Parties and the associated preparatory meetings;

(c) Support from the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe for the organization of the sessions of the Meetings of the Parties, the associated preparatory meetings and several side events and for the travel of non-governmental and governmental delegates, representatives of the judiciary and a number of participants from Aarhus Centres to the sessions of the Meetings of the Parties, side events and meetings of subsidiary bodies under the Convention and the Protocol;

(d) Support from the Regional Environmental Centre for Central and Eastern Europe for the organization of several side events and the travel of representatives of the judiciary and other legal professionals to the sessions of the Meetings of the Parties, side events and meetings of subsidiary bodies under the Convention and the Protocol;

(e) Support from the Governments of France, Italy and Sweden, the secretariat to the ECE Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes, the United Nations Environment Programme, the United Nations Institute for Training and Research, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the secretariat to the Convention on Biological Diversity and non-governmental organizations for the organization of side events on the margins of the sessions of the Meetings of the Parties.

## III. Estimated and projected expenditures

7. The costs shown in tables 4 and 5 below are estimated and projected. The costs are limited to those intended to be covered by voluntary contributions made under the Convention's and Protocol's schemes of financial arrangements through the trust fund. They do not include costs that are expected to be covered by the United Nations regular budget. Figures are rounded up. Figures may change in accordance with United Nations administrative regulations. Expenditures reported are those related to the implementation of the 2015–2017 and 2018–2021 work programmes of the Aarhus Convention. Protocol-related expenses are reported to the bodies of the Protocol.
