



Negotiated 2010 – 2014


Endorsed

at the 66th Session of the UNECE, April 2015

Main purpose

Ensure the access to decent, affordable and healthy housing in the ECE region





CHALLENGES IN THE EU AFFORDABILITY GAP

- 81.5 million Europeans 'overburdened' by housing costs.
- Housing costs much heavier burden for the people under the poverty threshold (41%) than for people above the threshold (18,6 %).
- The lack of investment in affordable housing amounts to around 57 billion EUR per year.
- Increasingly difficult for those who enter the housing market (48% of young adults live with their parents).

URBAN AGENDA FOR THE EU


- new form of cooperation between Member States, Cities, the EC and other stakeholders
- UAEU formalized in the Pact of Amsterdam
- aim: To give cities and regions a better position in European regulation and policy making
- three goals:
- 1) Better regulation
- 2) Better funding
- 3) Better knowledge sharing
- delivery mechanism: <u>Thematic Partnerships (eg Affordable Housing)</u>

DECLINING PUBLIC INVESTMENT

- Over the last ten years, overall public expenditure on building homes across the EU has gone down from around 40bn Euro in 2007 to around 27bn Euro in 2016.
- Public investment into building affordable housing has not only decreased nominally but also in terms of overall government expenditure.
