The global harmonization should continue to be considered in the framework of the 1998 Global Agreement for the 15 priorities as well as for the inclusion in the Compendium of Candidates for global technical regulations of three national United States of America regulations. In addition the Executive Committee will consider a draft Special Resolution concerning harmonized definitions of categories of vehicles, their masses and dimensions. Besides, WP.29 will receive reports of its six subsidiary bodies and consider their programme of work. Issues to be considered at the session, hosted by ECMT in Paris, include:  - Amendments to the AGTC Agreement, ext ending the combined road/rail transport network to Central Asia and the Caucasus countries;  - Monitoring of compliance by Contracting Parties with AGTC infrastructure and services standards;  - Adoption of "Model" action plans and framework agreements setting examples of good practices and benchmarks for efficient intermodal transport operations;  - Adoption of an opinion on ISO proposals to standardize 45 ft long maritime containers that are not compatible with most European road transport legislation. The principle objective for this event is to bring together a number of experts, primarily on oil and gas reserves, in order to collect their suggestions and ideas on the issue of reserves data transparency. The ultimate target of this initiative is both to create a universally recognised reporting system and to establish a procedure of compiling primary data on corporate and national reserves. A solid contribution in this regard is represented by UNECE's effort to implement one common code for the owners of information. The starting point will be the UN Framework Classification for Energy and Mineral Resources (UNFC).

The Task Force is expected to consider the revision of certain emission limit values for the metals covered by the Convention, namely cadmium, lead and mercury. It will also begin its review of the sufficiency and effectiveness of the Protocol, and consider the need for the Protocol to include additional metals, products or product groups.
