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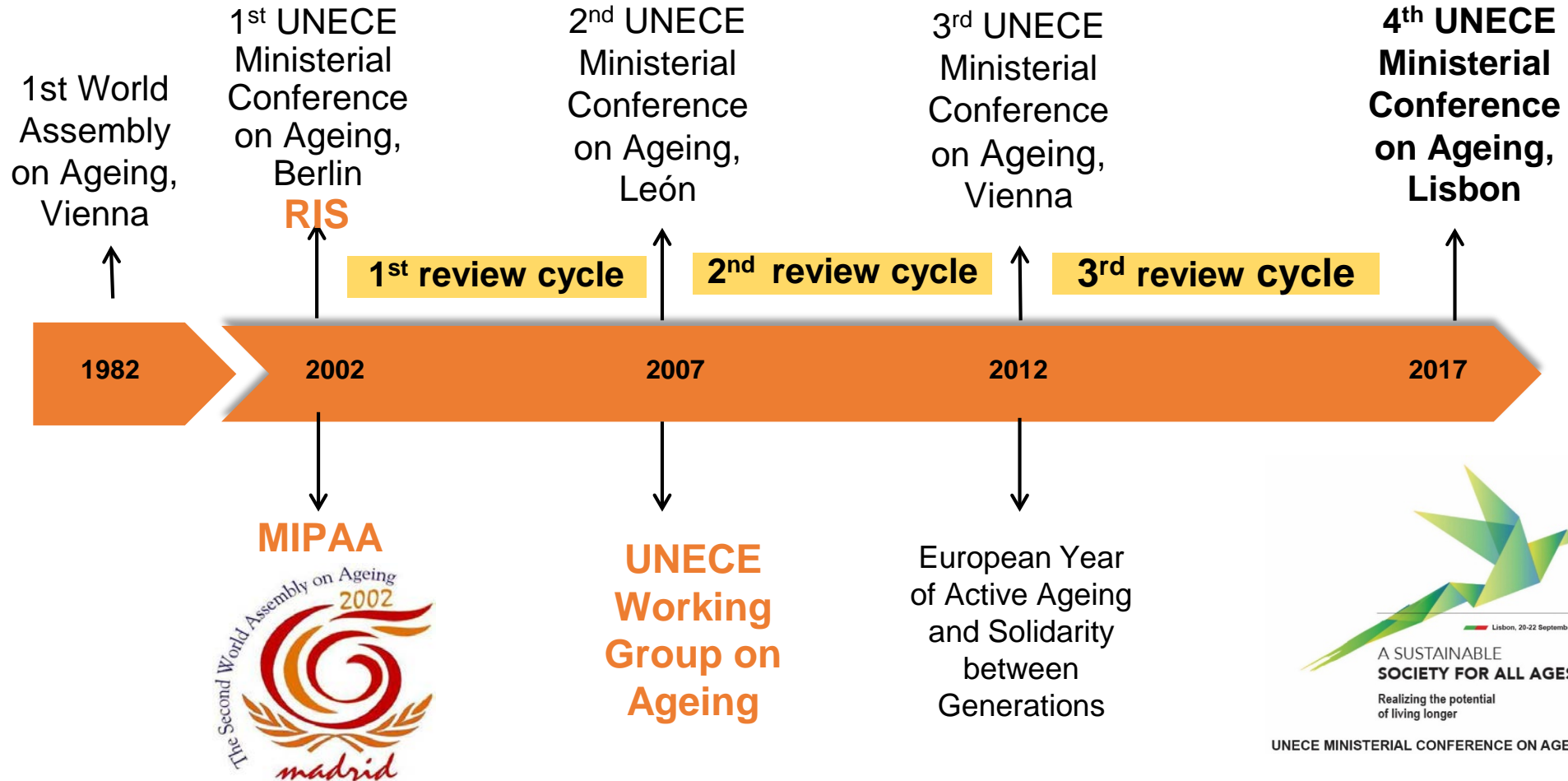
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MIPAA implementation in the UNECE Region: from Vienna to Lisbon



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Vienna Declaration – 4 priority goals

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Goal 1 - Longer working life is encouraged and ability to work is maintained

Goal 2 - Participation, non-discrimination and social inclusion of older persons are promoted

Goal 3 - Dignity, health and independence in older age are promoted and safeguarded

Goal 4 - Intergenerational solidarity is maintained and enhanced

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Method of reporting

Ageing-related legislation & policies

- Bottom-up participatory approach
- Quantitative and qualitative data
- Reporting on policies, strategies, legislation and special programmes implemented towards the four main goals of the Vienna Declaration 2012
- 3 main achievements and challenges: 10 Commitments of MIPAA/RIS

Ageing indicators

22 statistical indicators on active ageing

Over time: 2005, 2010, 2015

- Labour market (older people's contribution through paid activities)
- Participation in society (older people's contributions through unpaid activities)
- Independent, healthy and secure living
- Capacity and enabling environment for active ageing
- Other indicators (if applicable)

Findings of the MIPAA review

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Longer working life

- Labour market participation and labour market exit age have increased
- Pension reforms in 30 countries – retirement age up
- Delayed retirement and flexible transitions facilitated
- Early retirement discouraged
- Rehabilitation and re-entry to employment promoted
- Employment services targeted to older workers to tackle unemployment
- Lifelong learning and training opportunities fostered
- Age-based discrimination and negative attitudes towards older workers addressed

Findings of the MIPAA review

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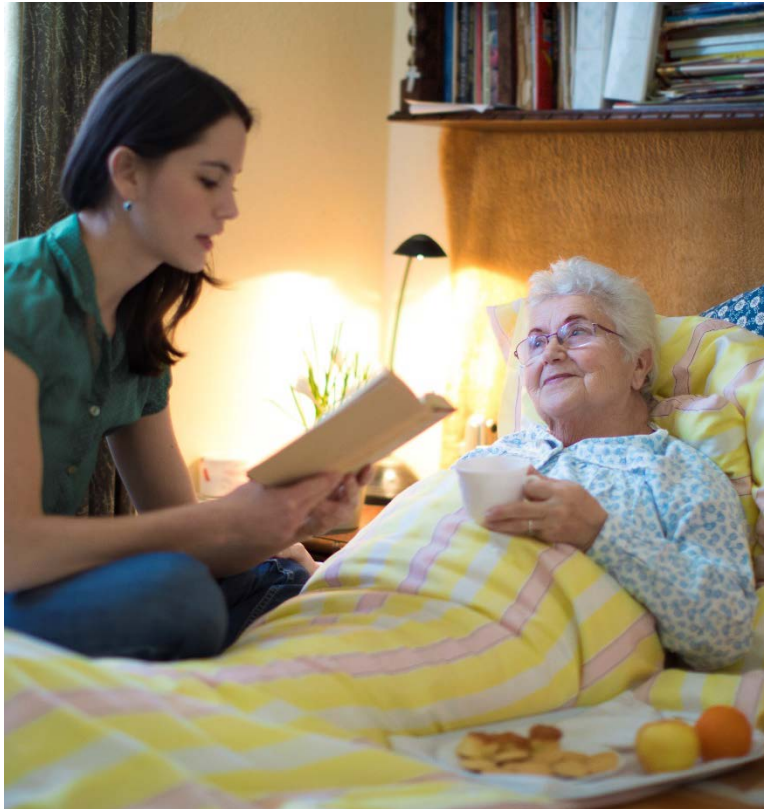
Participation, non-discrimination and social inclusion



- Promoting volunteering among older persons and diverse occasions for social interactions in the community
- Opportunities for lifelong learning, exercise, discounts for museums and theatres, celebrations and events
- Establishment of advisory bodies such as Older People Councils including at the municipal level
- Legislative reforms to ensure that age is included as a ground for discrimination
- Minimum income security, subsidized access to essential goods and services such as housing and transportation

Findings of the MIPAA review

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Dignity, health and independence

- Adaptation of health and social care, incl. long-term and palliative care
- Development of decentralized home care and home nursing
- Investments in age-appropriate housing adaptations and barrier-free public spaces and transportation
- Improve awareness, detection and response to discrimination, abuse, violence and neglect of older
- Enhance dementia preparedness
- Compensate some of the earnings lost and enhance job protection and flexibility, to support unpaid (family) caregivers

Findings of the MIPAA review

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Intergenerational solidarity

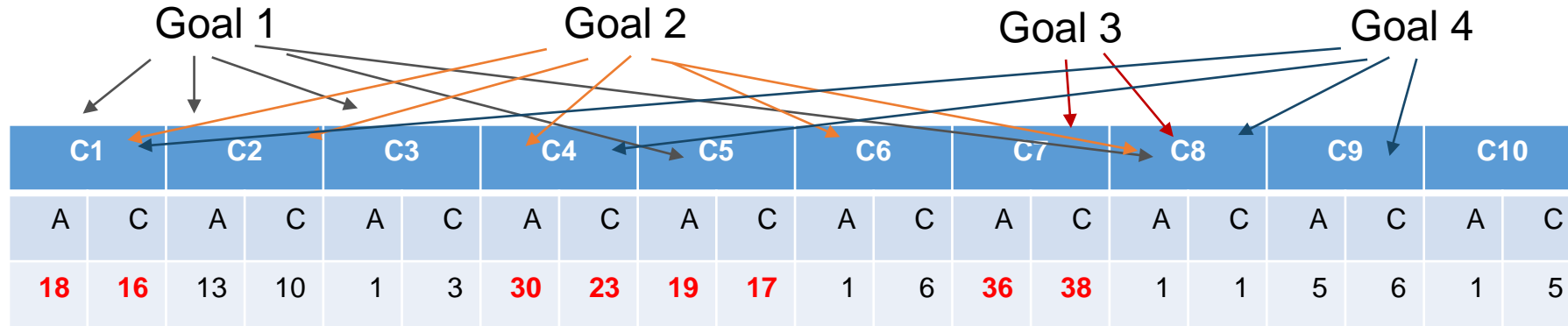
- Provision of opportunities for joint activities, including volunteering
- Educational initiatives to enhance understanding of ageing
- Ensuring sustainability of social security systems in the long run

Achievements and challenges

3 main achievements and challenges reported by the 10 commitments of MIPAA/RIS



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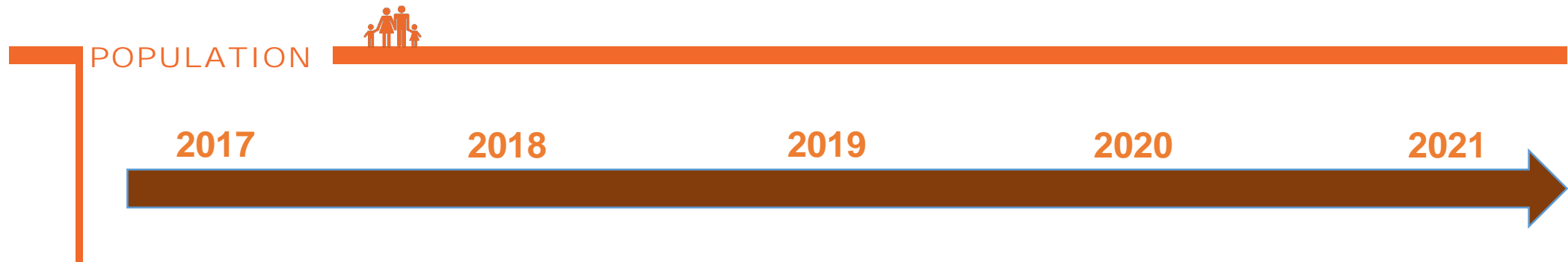


3 main achievements and challenges reported
