# THE CIF – FOB ADJUSTMENT IN BOP AND NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

## Main principles BPM/SNA


- Transactions between resident and non-resident institutional units
- General transaction principle: exports and imports of goods in theory based on change in ownership principle
- However by convention: uniform vaulation point for exports and imports of goods (general merchandise):
  - Exports and imports goods valued FOB (free on board) at customs frontier, regardless of any change in ownership has been taking place
- Raison d'être:
  - Global balancing exports and imports of goods, and global balancing of transportation (freight) services
  - Stability in the decomposition of change in value of exports and imports into change in volume and change in price




#### The CIF/FOB adjustment in Norway

- The merchandise trade in goods statistics (customs based) is main source (Intrastat not introduced in Norway). Here:
  - Exports of goods measured FOB (Free On Board) and
  - Imports of goods measured CIF (Cost, Insurance, Freight included)
- Exports and imports of goods in NA/BoP on detailed product level:
  - Exports of goods valued FOB (free on board)
  - Imports of goods recorded at CIF-value (Cost, Insurance, Freight)
- Both exports and imports of goods on aggregated product level are however recorded at FOB-value (Free On Board):
  - Separate item for imports of freight services
- How to make this adjustment from imports CIF to imports FOB?

# Estimation of transportation (freight) and insurance services in imports of goods

- Full-scale system of customs declarations
  - Single Administrative Document (SAD)
- Exploit the detailed information in the SAD including:
  - statistical value (CIF), delivery terms, freight value, nationality of transport means
- Data on declarations sufficient to estimate:
  - a ratio of total freight and insurance on goods imports CIF to arrive at goods imports at FOB value
  - insurance is estimated using a fixed ratio
  - import value of freight by type
    - sea
    - air
    - road
    - rail
  - geographical allocation of imports of transportation and insurance

## Adjustments of exports of freight services

- Transportation services on imports of goods recorded CIF and supplied by Norwegian transportation enterprises are included in exports of Transportation services
- When adjusting imports of goods from CIF to FOB, exports of transportation services must be adjusted accordingly
- According to the 2007 table, 37% of transportation of imports of goods are supplied by Norwegian carriers, equivalent to NOK 8 276 million.
- Accordingly exports of transportation services is reduced by the same amount when imports goods are presented FOB.
