- ➤ ALL CIS member states state parties of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women New York, 18 December 1979
- Participation at the Convention has stimulated national governments to change their attitudes towards increasing measures to protect women against discrimination and to promote policies for gender equality implementation

 - **Education**
 - **Employment**
 - > Health
 - Protection of women in locked custodies
 - Violence against women at home and at work place
 - > Trafficking in women
 - > Life of women from the most vulnerable groups

Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women



- ▶ Participation in the Convention = Existence of monitoring mechanism to monitoring of its implementation – periodic reporting to the COMMITTEE ON THE ELIMINATION OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN
- ➤ Development of the reports simulated countries for revision of programs of statistical data collection in gender aspect, their analysis through Convention requirements
- > COMMITTEE ON THE ELIMINATION OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN:
 - Positive changes in statitical data collection
 - > Formulated recommendations for further development of statistics





- ➤ Raise public awareness of the concept of gender, the principle of equality between women and men and the need to eliminate gender stereotypes
- Ensure that the media promote positive images of women as active participants in social, economic and political life
- ➤ To collect in the next census comprehensive statistical data, disaggregated by sex and age, on the situation of disadvantaged groups of women, including Roma women, women with disabilities, women in rural areas and older women, in all areas covered by the Convention
- To enhance the system of data collection and thematic surveys on family and sexual violence to ensure that data are disaggregated by type of violence, gender, age, ethnicity, and by relationship between the perpetrator and the victim

- > To collect data on women drug users in prisons and in society at large to^
 - determine the extent of the problem, with a view to developing appropriate drug dependency interventions and
 - determining the number of those living with HIV/AIDS in need of medical
- Intensify efforts to research through special surveys trafficking in women and girls and exploitation of prostitution, including ellection of data desegregated by gender, age, ethnicity


