# The European Green Deal

- The roadmap for making the EU economy sustainable and preserving and restoring ecosystems and biodiversity
  - Climate neutrality by 2050 proposal for a Climate Law
  - European Climate Pact
  - Renovation Wave
  - Farm2Fork
  - Forest Strategy
  - and many more



# The European Green Deal

- And a new, more ambitious EU strategy on adaptation to climate change (Q1 2021).
  - strengthen efforts on climate-proofing, resilience building, prevention and preparedness
  - influence public & private investments, including on nature-based solutions
  - across the EU, investors, insurers, businesses, cities and citizens are able to:
    - access climate-relevant data
    - develop instruments to integrate CC into risk management practices

## **EU Adaptation to Climate Change – a timeline**

- 2008 Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union Article 191 combating climate change an objective of EU environmental policy.
- 2009 White Paper 'Adapting to climate change: Towards a European framework for action' research, mainstreaming and knowledge actions initiated;: Climate-ADAPT platform in March 2012
- 2013 Adaptation Strategy
  - Promoting action by Member States; Better informed decision-making; Climate-proofing EU action
  - As of April 2020, all Member States have an adaptation strategy or an adaptation plan
- 2014 Monitoring Mechanism Regulation (MMR) sets the EU's own internal reporting rules on the basis of internationally agreed obligations. 1st reporting took place in 2015, and 2nd (and last) in 2019.
- 2018 Energy Union Governance Regulation expands on the MMR for adaptation reporting (next, the Implementing Act)
- 2020 Draft Climate Law
  - The relevant Union institutions and the Member States shall ensure continuous progress in enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening resilience and reducing vulnerability to climate change in accordance with Article 7 of the Paris Agreement.
  - Member States shall develop and implement adaptation strategies and plans that include comprehensive risk management frameworks, based on robust climate and vulnerability baselines and progress assessments.



## Process towards the new Adaptation Strategy

- Published Roadmap/Inception Impact Assessment
- Open Public Consultation from 14 May to 20 August
  - 1000 replies, 100s of position papers
- Consultation with Member States and Stakeholders
- High level events to position the new strategy
  - Climate Adaptation Summit (January 2021)
  - DE Presidency Water and Adaptation conference (November 2020)
- Adoption of new strategy in Q1 2021





## Blueprint – towards the new strategy

- improve knowledge of climate impacts;
- reinforce planning and climate risk management;
- accelerate action with a focus on
  - solutions (in addition to understanding),
  - deploying innovation (in addition to research),
  - implementation (in addition to planning),
  - and prevention (in addition to ex-post).





## Blueprint – possible novelties

- Closing the climate protection gap
- Reinforced global action for climate resilience
- Adapting forests and other ecosystems for an adapting society
- Observatory of health and climate change
- More and better data
- Preventing damage to infrastructure and beyond





## Coherence across policy spectrum

- The European Green Deal as framework:
  - Forest Strategy designed concurrently
  - Biodiversity strategy CC as key driver of loss
  - Farm to fork resilience in food chain
  - Review of EU trade policy global value chains and spillovers
  - Renovation wave recovery as opportunity to increase resilience
  - Horizon Europe Mission on Adaptation (including societal transformation) to be a key vector for the new strategy

## Preparing for 2021 Governance Regulation reporting

### **January**

### December

- Prepare reporting obligations and templates
- Identify quality checks for the data submissions (warnings, blockers, etc.)
- Nominations of national reporters to the Commission

## 2020

- Reportnet 3 goes live
- Link Reportnet 3 to the single entry point on the Commission's Energy Union and Climate Action ePlatform
- Prepare data handling flows
- Establish access rights and confidentiality restrictions

- Training for Member States
- Testing
- Launch reporting
- Monitor and assist users

Continuous communication with Commission, Member States, experts from European Topic Centres, etc.

### **Reporting streams covered:**

- Policies and Measures (PaMs)
- GHG Projections
- National systems for PaMs and GHG

   Use of auctioning revenues
   Financial and technology su
- Approximated GHG inventories
- National adaptation actions
  - Financial and technology support provided to developing countries
