- new data and information,
- new level of disaggregating

- no methodology for some indicators,
- necessary in disaggregating of data and,
- comparability between countries

Since 2016 Statistical Committee of the CIS (CIS-Stat) has been working on SDGs' indicators. Basic steps by now:

- in 2016, a special survey of the options of CIS countries on the global list of SDGs' indicators was conducted;
- a priority regional list of SDGs' indicators was formed;
- at the end of 2016 on the website of the CISStat the platform “Statistics for SDGs: CIS Region” was created;
- in 2017, a pilot publication of the of the results of monitoring of the SDGs' indicators is planned.



The purpose of the survey is the question of the availability of methodology and statistical information in the countries for monitoring progress of implementation of SDGs.

As a result:

- “gaps” in statistical data and in methodology for global list of indicators were identified;
- there are significant problems with the levels of data disaggregation (“completeness of coverage” vs. “level of details of data”).

The survey is one of the tools for assessing countries' readiness to report on SDGs' indicators (the UNECE “Road map” on Statistics for SDGs, section IV).

CIS-Stat in partnership with the national statistical offices of CIS-member states has developed the list of 111 indicators out of the total 231 global SDG indicators, which are of the highest priority for the region.

The key criteria for selection of priority indicators was their ranking vis-à-vis situation in the countries of the region.

Russian and English versions of the list of selected for CIS countries indicators are available on official CIS-Stat website www.cisstat.org in the section "Statistics for SDGs: CIS region".

Terminology and methodology for collection and calculation of about 1/3 of selected 111 indicators currently are not available and have to be clarified and/or developed.

4.6.1 Percentage of population in a given age group achieving at least a fixed level of proficiency in functional (a) literacy, by sex
