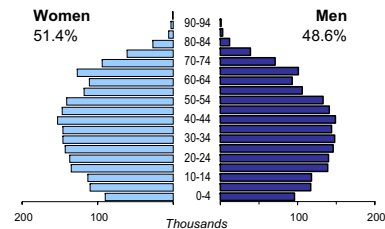

Population by age, 2005

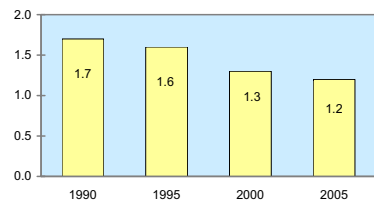

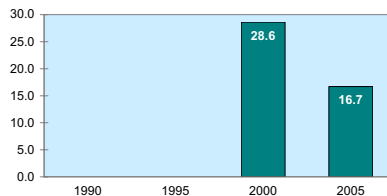

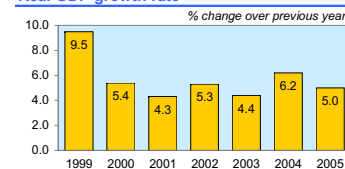

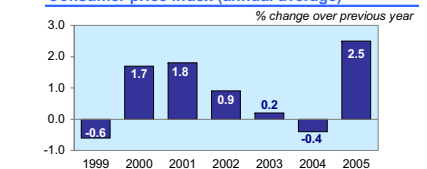

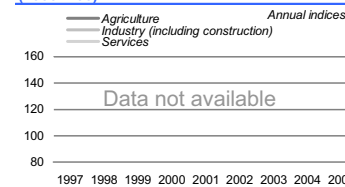

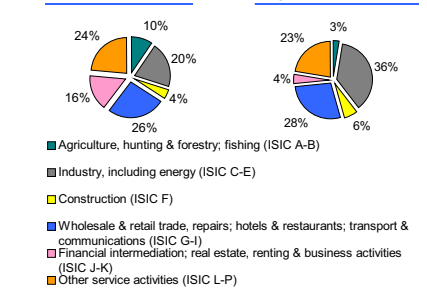

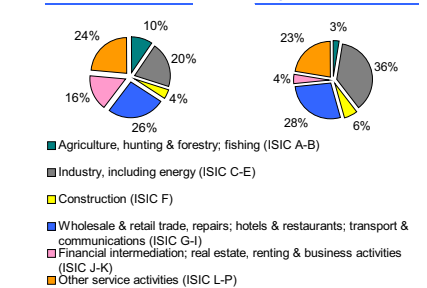
GDP in agriculture, industry, and services (2000=100)
