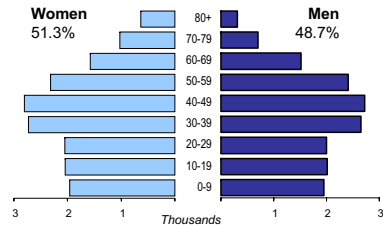

Population by age, 2004

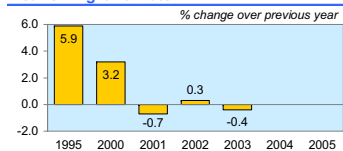

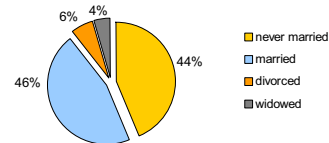
Real GDP growth rate



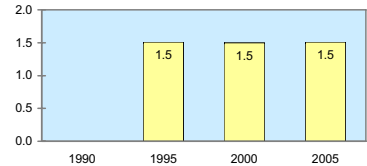

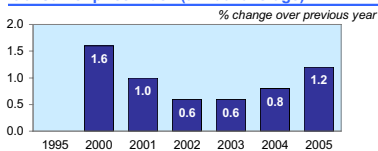
Legal marital status, population aged 18+, 2005

Consumer price index (annual average)



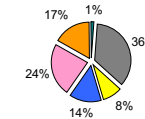
