### **2. Climate Change and Transport Networks and Nodes: Presentations of initiatives at national and international levels**

GE.3 will discuss initiatives at national and international levels on climate change impacts and adaptation for transport networks and nodes and agree on the ways to include them in its final report as national or international case studies. Experts from Canada, Germany, Finland, France, the Netherlands and Poland will table their case studies as official documents. These case studies should be updated in line with the guidance provided at the sixteenth session. Additional case studies may be tabled as informal documents.
