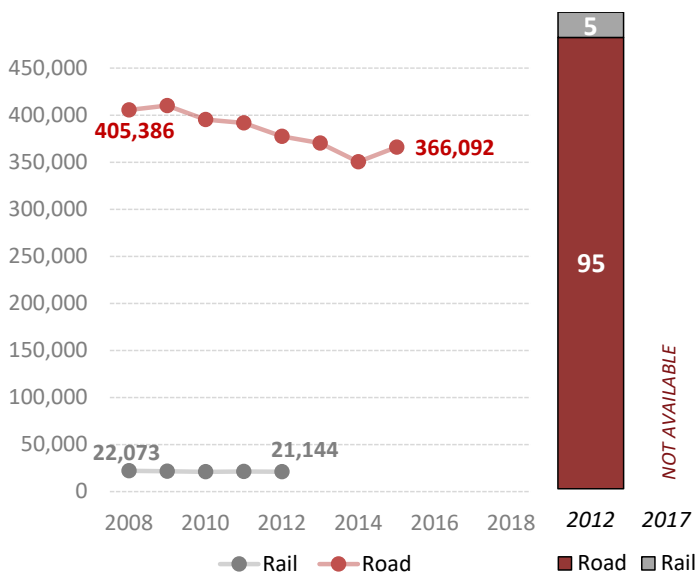

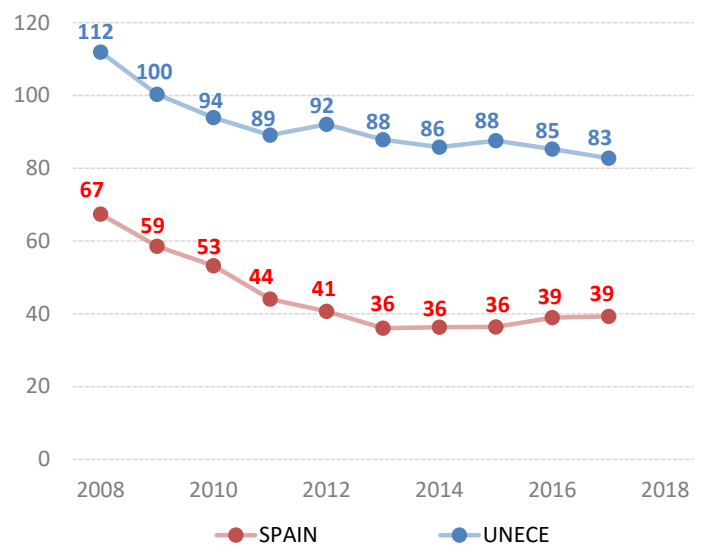

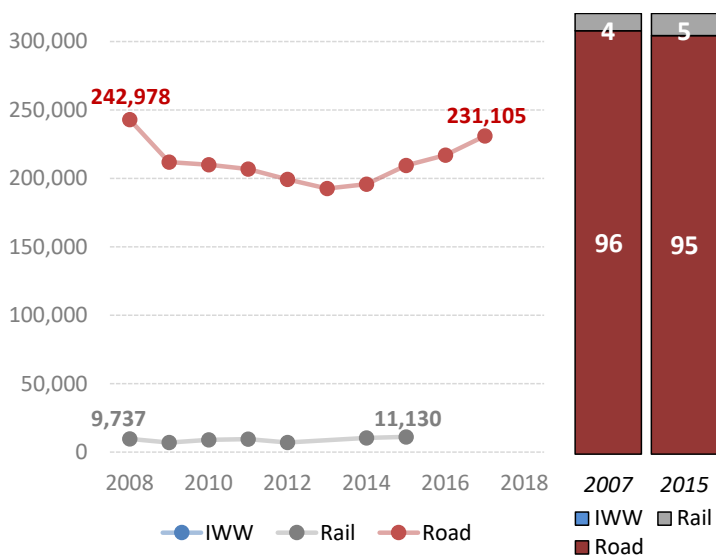
### Passenger-km by mode (million) and modal share (%)<sup>1</sup>



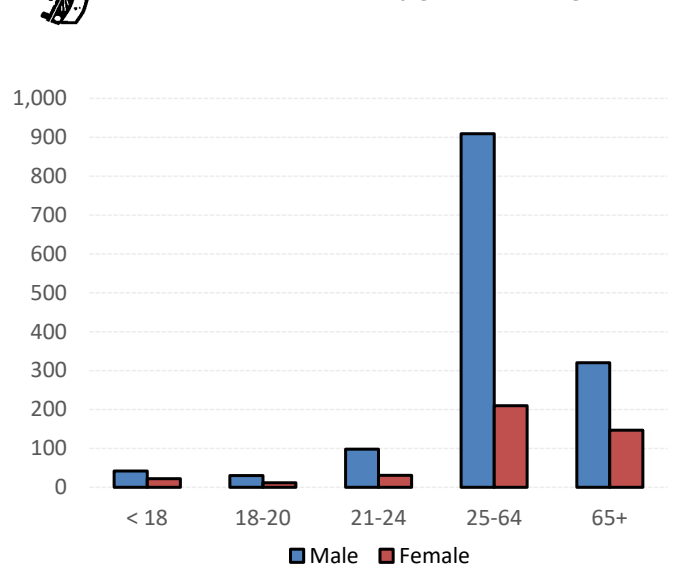
### Road fatalities per million inhabitants<sup>2</sup>
