PROTOCOL ON COMBINED TRANSPORT ON INLAND WATERWAYS TO  
THE EUROPEAN AGREEMENT ON IMPORTANT INTERNATIONAL  
COMBINED TRANSPORT LINES AND RELATED INSTALLATIONS (AGTC)  
OF 1991

GENEVA, 17 JANUARY 1997

ENTRY INTO FORCE: 29 OCTOBER 2009, IN ACCORDANCE WITH  
ARTICLE 9 (1) OF THE PROTOCOL

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary,  
communicates the following:

On 31 July 2009, the conditions for the entry into force of the Protocol were met. Accordingly,  
the Protocol will enter into force on 29 October 2009, in accordance with its article 9 (1), which reads as  
follows:

“1. This Protocol shall enter into force 90 days after the date on which the governments of five  
States have deposited an instrument of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession, provided that one  
or more waterways of the international inland waterway network for combined transport link, in a  
continuous manner, the territories of at least three of the States which have deposited such an  
instrument.”
