Why do we need a TF on measuring new forms of international migration?


- Migration patterns are not static; they change according to global events, policies and opportunities.
- Quality evidence needed in this area to make policy
- Unfeasible to use past behaviours and patterns of movement to make the assumptions required to generate statistics.
- Will complement but be distinct from the other developments in migration Task Forces

The objective of the Task Force is:



- a. To investigate what the needs and opportunities are to measure new forms of migration.
- b. To consider opportunities for joint research within the Task Force, for example to look for those leaving one country arriving in the destination country by a range of definitions.
- c. To provide a review of what is happening and what is possible, with a view to formulate recommendations for national statistical offices ensuring consistency with existing standard terms and definitions.
