### **QUOTA FREE REGIME FOR “GREEN” AND “GREENER AND SAFE” GOODS ROAD VEHICLES**

**( in accordance with Article 3§3 MoU and the Joint Statement on the Implementation of Article 3)**

#### **Note by the UNECE Secretariat**

The table included below presents the status of implementation, as of 31 July 2001, of Article 3 paragraph 3 of the MoU providing for a quota-free regime for bilateral and transit road transport of goods among SECI participating States, for “green” and “greener and safer” lorries. Governments of Hungary and Slovenia have entered reservations to Article 3, paragraph 3, and are not expected to comply with its provisions. The information was provided by different countries' RRTC representatives.

The Committee may wish to clarify the purpose and scope of this table and may wish to agree on a common understanding of the information to be contained therein. This would avoid misunderstandings and conflicting information. For instance, the Committee may wish to agree on the understanding of a quota-free regime and differentiate (for the purpose of this table) between quota-free regimes on one hand and permits and charges systems on the other.

## ANNEX II

This table shows the status of implementation of Article 3, paragraph 3 of the MoU providing for a **quota-free regime** for bilateral and transit road transport of goods among SECI participating States, for **“green” and “greener and safe” lorries**. Governments of Hungary and Slovenia have entered reservations to Article 3, paragraph 3, and are not expected to comply with its provisions.
